ITEM IDENTIFICATION:

Report #2 on Recognized Campus Groups (2008-09)

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The *Policy on the Recognition of Campus Groups* provides that the administration is responsible for the implementation of the *Policy*, including the granting, denying or withdrawing of recognition. Such administrative decisions are to be reported regularly to the University Affairs Board for information.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

This report is presented to the Board twice each year for information. This is the second report for this year.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The size and diversity of the student community at the University of Toronto provides an extraordinary number of opportunities for students to participate in a vast array of activities undertaken by campus organizations. Participation in these groups forms an integral part of the student experience. Campus groups contribute in a variety of ways to the educational, intellectual, recreational, social and cultural life of the University community. For many students, involvement in voluntary campus organizations is not only a traditional part of campus life, it forms a significant component of their learning while at the University.

Many recognized campus organizations engage in co-curricular activities which enrich the participation of their members in their own academic programs. Involvement in a campus organization can also provide significant learning opportunities for students with

respect to leadership, civic and community engagement, and organizational capacity. Since many campus organizations address the complex issues of the world around us, engagement in a campus group can often provide important opportunities to be exposed to different ideas and perspectives. This helps the University provide meaningful opportunities for debate and dissent, and fosters the development of students' understanding of difference. Finally, participation in campus groups provides one means by which students integrate and engage with small communities within the University of Toronto.

The report incorporates lists of groups recognized by the University which are based at St. George, U of T Mississauga and U of T Scarborough. Mississauga-based groups are currently recognized by the Student Life Programs office in cooperation with the UTM Office of Student Affairs. Scarborough-based groups are recognized by the UTSC Student Life office.

As indicated in the report, the cumulative total reported membership of the organizations recognized through the Student Life Programs office exceeds 127,000 people. While there is likely to be considerable overlap in membership among groups, this is a positive indication of the degree to which students engage in the extra-curricular and co-curricular activities. Moreover, when one considers these participation rates along the numbers of students that are also engaged in formal and informal athletics and recreation activities, the clubs and committees of Hart House, and many informal organizations, which for a variety of reasons choose not to seek recognition, there is a good indication that a great many students are involved in campus life outside of the classroom.

To the present, 422 campus groups have met the requirements for recognition and have been granted University recognition for the 2008-09 year by the Student Life Programs office (which administers recognition for both the St. George and UTM campuses). A total of 417 groups received recognition during the entire 2007-08 year. The Office of Student Life at UTSC has granted recognition to a total of 151 groups.

No recognition has been denied or withdrawn in this session.

FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

There are no significant financial implications for the University's operating budget.

SUBJECT: **RECOGNIZED CAMPUS GROUPS 2008-09, REPORT #2**

The size and diversity of the student community at the University of Toronto provides an extraordinary number of opportunities for students to participate in a vast array of activities undertaken by campus organizations. Participation in these groups forms an integral part of the student experience. Campus groups contribute in a variety of ways to the educational, intellectual, recreational, social and cultural life of the University community. For many students, involvement in voluntary campus organizations is not only a traditional part of campus life, it forms a significant component of their learning while at the University.

Many recognized campus organizations engage in co-curricular activities which enrich the participation of their members in their own academic programs. Involvement in a campus organization can also provide significant learning opportunities for students with respect to leadership, civic and community engagement, and organizational capacity. Since many campus organizations address the complex issues of the world around us, engagement in a campus group can often provide important opportunities to be exposed to different ideas and perspectives. This helps the University provide meaningful opportunities for debate and dissent, and fosters the development of students' understanding of difference. Finally, participation in campus groups provides one means by which students integrate and engage with small communities within the University of Toronto.

In accordance with the University's *Policy on Recognition of Campus Groups*, this is a report on administrative decisions to grant, deny or withdraw recognition in this academic year. The campus groups listed below have been granted recognition until September 30, 2009. All groups that have been granted recognition for the 2008-09 academic year are listed here. Recognition for groups based on St. George and UTM is granted by the Student Life Programs office. The UTSC Office of Student Life grants recognition for groups based at UTSC.

Recognition of campus groups by the University provides a number of benefits and opportunities:

- 1) the right to use the name of the University in the name of the group and in conjunction with group activities;
- 2) eligibility to use meeting and event spaces;
- 3) use of other University facilities and meeting spaces at no cost or at a lower cost compared to external organizations;
- 4) eligibility to apply for temporary office space;
- 5) access to web site hosting services for the organization and other Internet services;
- 6) listings in directories provided to the University community and to the public as an official University of Toronto campus group;
- 7) verification letters confirming recognition status (sometimes required by banks and other external organizations); and
- 8) access to other services and resources.

An organization seeking recognition must submit an annual application to the Office of Student Life Programs (for St. George and UTM) or to the Office of Student Life (for UTSC) and a copy of group's constitution. The constitution should outline the group's purpose, objectives and procedures. It should address organizational structure, membership, meetings, the election or appointment of members in leadership positions, amendments to the constitution, and rules of conduct. A commitment to democracy and accountability to members should also be reflected.

Full membership in a recognized campus group (including eligibility to vote and serve in a leadership position) must be open to any member of the University community (including all students, staff, faculty and alumni) from any division. While discriminatory membership practices are not allowed, it is acknowledged that certain groups could well be homogeneous in nature without being discriminatory. Status as non-voting members may be extended to interested persons from outside the University.

Groups seeking recognition by the University must be genuine campus organizations and generally non-profit in nature. A recognized campus group cannot be controlled by any external body. However, many organizations are affiliated with national or international bodies and other external groups.

Under the terms of the *Policy*, the University will not attempt to censor, control or interfere with any group on the basis of its philosophy, beliefs, interests or opinions expressed unless and until these lead to activities which are illegal or which infringe the rights and freedoms of others within the community. By the same token, recognition as a campus group implies neither endorsement of a group's beliefs or philosophy, nor the assumption of legal liability for the group's activities.

Please note that pursuant to the *Policy*, the recognition of groups which draw their membership from only one academic division is delegated to the governance body of that

division. The *Policy* requires that the recognition of groups which draw their membership from more than one academic division be reported to the University Affairs Board for information.

It is important to note that there are hundreds of additional clubs, many athletics and recreation activities, as well as Hart House clubs and committees, which, while not listed here, add significantly to the educational, intellectual, recreational, social and cultural life of the U of T community.
