ITEM IDENTIFICATION:

Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees – Student Society Fees: Student Society Proposals for Fee Increases

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The terms of reference of the University Affairs Board provide that the Board approves the establishment of and changes to compulsory non-academic incidental fees including those collected on behalf of student societies.

The administrative procedures are outlined in the *Policy on Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the *Handbook for Student Societies* (published by the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students). Pursuant to the *Policy*, requests for increases to fees must be supported by due constitutional and fair processes within student societies.

Requests for increases are brought forward to the Board by the administration on the assurances of the student societies that due constitutional procedures have been followed.

Increases which are greater than the cost of living must be supported by a positive result in a recent referendum. Requests for increases which are less than or equal to the cost of living must be supported by a previous referendum approving annual increases by an established inflation factor. When such a provision is approved by referendum, annual increases, no greater than the Ontario Consumer Price Index of the previous December (or no greater than a specific inflation factor approved by referendum), may be requested upon approval of the board or council of the organization.

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PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

Requests for changes to existing fees and/or the establishment of new fees are brought forward to the Board on one or more occasions each year. This is the first set of requests on behalf of student societies brought forward this year.

Additional information is provided on the referenced pages in the attached memorandum from Jim Delaney, Director, Office of the Vice-Provost, Students.

The requests have been reviewed by the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students in light of the requirements of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and are found to be in compliance. Therefore, the requests are recommended for approval.

FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

There are no significant implications for the University's operating budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the University Affairs Board approve the following:

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS)** fee be increased as follows: (a) by \$0.04 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) / CFS-Ontario portion of the fee; and (b) by \$2.22 per session in the Accident & Prescription Drug Plan portion of the fee. If approved, the total APUS fee will be \$79.79 per session, charged to all part-time undergraduate students on all three campuses.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Engineering Society** fee be increased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.27 per session in the Society portion of the fee for all full-time Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students; (b) continuation of the Blue Sky Solar Team portion of the fee; and (c) continuation of the Concrete Canoe Team portion of the fee. If approved, the total Engineering Society fee will be increased to \$123.45 per session, charged to all full-time Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students. The fee for part-time students would remain unchanged at \$20.99.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Faculty of Information Studies Students Council (FISSC)** fee be increased by \$12.50 per session (\$6.25 per session part-time) in order to establish a society portion of the fee. If approved, the total FISSC fee charged will be increased to \$62.50 per session for full-time students (\$31.25 for part-time students), charged to all Master of Information students.

THAT, beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Graduate Students' Union (GSU)** fee be increased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.35 per session for full-time students (\$0.17 for part-time students) in the society's portion of the fee; (b) an increase of \$0.03 per session for full-time students (\$0.01 per session for part-time students) in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) – CFS-Ontario portion of the fee; (c) a decrease of \$1.92 per session (full-time students only) (including provincial sales tax) in the Supplementary Health Coverage portion of the fee; (d) an increase of \$5.96 per session full-time and part-time students (including provincial sales tax) in the Dental Plan portion of the fee; (e) an increase of \$0.50 per session (full-time students only) in the Supplementary Health Coverage Administrative Fee portion of the fee; (f) an increase of \$0.50 per session in the Dental Plan Administrative Fee portion of the fee; and (g) the establishment of a new designated portion of the of \$1.00 per session for full-time students (\$0.50 for part-time students) for University of Toronto Bikechain. If approved, the total GSU fee will be increased to \$215.90 per session for full-time students (\$87.95 per session for part-time students), charged to all graduate students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Innis College Student Society (ICSS)** fee be decreased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.22 per session in the society portion of the fee; and (b) the elimination of the designated portion of the fee of \$0.50 per session for the Harold Innis Foundation. If approved, the total ICSS fee will be \$21.93 per session, charged to all full-time and part-time Innis College students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Erindale College Student Union (operating as the University of Toronto Mississauga Students' Union; UTMSU)** fee be increased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.15 per session in the society portion of the fee; (b) an increase of \$0.97 per session in the UPass portion of the fee; (c) an increase of \$0.01 per session for the Academic Societies portion of the fee; (d) an increase of \$0.01 per session for the Food Bank portion of the fee; and (e) an increase of \$0.01 per session for the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee. If approved, the total UTMSU fee will be increased to \$82.09 per session, charged to all full-time undergraduate University of Toronto at Mississauga students.

THAT on the condition that the SCCR Board of Directors approve the resolution to seek the increase, beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Scarborough Campus Community Radio (SCCR)** fee be increased by \$0.04 in the society portion of the fee. If approved, the total SCCR fee will be increased to \$3.59 per session, charged to all full-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students.

THAT beginning in the summer 2010 session, the **Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU)** fee be increased by \$40.00 per session for full-time students (\$8.00 per session for part-time students) for a UTSC Sports & Recreation Complex. If approved, the total SCSU fee charged during the summer 2010 session will be \$110.69 per session for full-time students (\$19.88 for part-time students), charged to all undergraduate University of Toronto Scarborough students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU)** fee be increased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.28 per session for full-time students (\$0.02 for part-time students) in the society portion of the fee; (b) an increase of \$0.08 per session (full-time students only) in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) – CFS-Ontario portion of the fee; (c) an increase of \$0.41 per session for full-time students (\$0.12 for part-time students) in the Student Centre portion of the fee; (d) a decrease of \$3.08 per session (including administration fee and provincial sales tax) in the Accident & Prescription Drug Plan portion of fee; (e) an increase of \$3.75 per session (including administration fee and provincial sales tax); and (f) continuation of the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee through fall/winter 2010-11. If approved, the total SCSU fee will be increased to \$165.56 per session for full-time students (\$11.98 for part-time students), charged to all undergraduate University of Toronto Scarborough students.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Students' Administrative Council (operating as the University of Toronto Students' Union; UTSU)** fees be increased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.20 per session in the society portion of the fee; (b) an increase of \$0.01 per session in the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee; (c) an increase of \$0.08 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) – CFS-Ontario portion of the fee; (d) an increase of \$5.48 per session (including administration fee and provincial sales tax) in the Accident & Prescription Drug Plan portion of fee; and (e) an increase of \$4.67 per session for the Dental Plan portion (including administration fee and provincial sales tax); and (f) for full-time undergraduates on the St. George Campus only, an increase of the fee for the Student Common Project of \$0.51 per session. If approved, the total UTSU-St. George fee will increase to \$149.92 for all full-time undergraduate students on the St. George Campus; and the total UTSU-UTM fee will increase to \$142.08, charged to all full-time undergraduate students on the U of T at Mississauga campus.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, **The Varsity** fee be increased by \$0.02 per session in the society portion of the fee. If approved, the total Varsity fee will be increased to \$1.29 per session, charged to all full-time undergraduate University of Toronto students.

Subject: **Student Society Proposals for Fee Increases**

Requests from a number of student societies for the fee changes listed below have been received by the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students. The applications have been reviewed in light of the requirements of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees*, are found to be in compliance with these requirements, and are recommended for approval.

Requests for fee increases from student societies must meet a number of requirements. Section 2 of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* outlines the University's general expectations:

Requests to change the fee collected on behalf of a student society and requests for new fees shall be approved only when evidence has been presented that the request has been authorized by due constitutional process in the organization.

Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is not greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices for Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada (December-over-December) as of December 31 of the previous year, the request must be supported by the results of a previous referendum approving the principle of a cost-of-living adjustment. Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices, the request must be supported by the majority of the society's members voting in a recent referendum.

The procedures for handling fee change requests (from the *Handbook for Student Societies* published by this office) also provide that requests for a fee increase must be supplied with the following:

Evidence that the request to change the existing fee (or to institute a new charge) has been authorized by due constitutional process of the organization. This evidence should include a copy of or specific reference to the section of the society's constitution which relates to the mechanism for fee changes, minutes of the meeting at which the resolution to request the change was passed, details and results of any referenda related to the subject which may have been held within the division, and publicity given the matter to ensure that those who may be affected by the change are

aware of the proposal, including size and purpose of the increase, and have had the opportunity to make their views known.

Normally, the administration intersects with these processes at two points. Initially, we ask student societies to seek advice from this office on the wording of referendum questions (with respect to clarity and technical language). The second point occurs after the referendum when the student society makes the formal request for a fee increase. The recommendation for approval is derived from the assessment of whether or not the society has met the requirements established in the *Policy* and the relevant procedures.

Occasionally, the Office is asked to look into complaints about referendum procedures and compliance with relevant portions of the society's constitution and/or by-laws. The results of these investigations play a significant role in the assessment of the request and the recommendation for approval.

The assessment of requests for fee increases is normally based upon the following expectations:

- 1) The student society must make the request in a manner consistent with the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the University's procedures for increases to student society fees;
- 2) When required, there must be a positive result in a referendum for a fee increase (special conditions established by the society, such as quorum, must also be met);
- 3) The referendum question itself should be clear and provide enough information to students in order to gain a full understanding of the implications of the question and proposed fee for them;
- 4) The referendum must be held in a fair manner, advertised and promoted in a reasonable manner, and the members of each organization should be given a reasonable opportunity to vote; and
- 5) Each organization must comply with the provisions of its own by-laws, rules of procedure, and specific policies and procedures approved by the society's board or council.

Societies which have previously received approval (by referendum) from their members for an annual cost of living increase in the society's portion of the fee may request increases, upon approval by the society's board or council, of up to the previous Ontario December to December cost of living increase (consumer price index) calculated by Statistics Canada. The December 2009 consumer price index for Ontario was 1.2%.

The Students' Administrative Council (SAC)¹, the Graduate Students' Union (GSU), the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS), and the Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU) may request increases in the designated portions of their fees for health and dental plans at a rate established by approval of a previous referendum. SAC, APUS and SCSU may request increases in their health plan fees of up to 10%. The GSU

may request increases in the health plan fee of an amount less than or equal to a health industry index.

It is important to note that when dealing with a student society request for a fee change, it is the society's own constitution, by-laws or established policies that set the standards for acceptable results in referenda. In some cases, society constitutions establish a minimum voter turnout in order to consider a referendum result to be valid. The University has not established additional criteria with respect to valid referendum voter turnout.

Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS)

Background

In fall/winter 2009-10, the APUS fee was \$77.54 per session charged to all part-time undergraduate students on all campuses. The fee includes \$3.43 per session for membership in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and CFS-Ontario (CFS-O) and \$31.68 (including provincial sales tax) per session for the Accident & Prescription Drug Insurance Plan.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 12, 2010, the APUS Assembly of Class Representatives approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the CFS/CFS-O portion of the APUS fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 2) An inflationary increase in the Accident & Prescription Drug Insurance Plan portion of the fee to begin in September 2010.

At its meeting on March 12, 2010, the APUS Assembly of Class Representatives ratified the request for an increase in Health Care Premium.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

Recommendation:

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS)** fee be increased as follows: (a) by \$0.04 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) / CFS-Ontario portion of the fee; and (b) by \$2.22 per session in the Accident & Prescription Drug Plan portion of the fee. If approved, the total APUS fee will be \$79.79 per session, charged to all part-time undergraduate students on all three campuses.

Engineering Society

Background

In fall/winter 2009/10, the Engineering Society fee was \$123.18 per session for full-time Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering students (\$20.99 per session for part-time students and Professional Experience Year (PEY) students). The fee includes \$22.05 per session (\$20.99 part-time) for the society, \$2.75 per session (\$0.00 part-time) for the Blue Sky Solar Car Team; and \$1.63 per session (\$0.00 part-time) for the Concrete Canoe Team. The mandates to continue to charge the Blue Sky Solar Car and the C Concrete Canoe Team portions of the fee end this year.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase to the society portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 9, 2010 the University of Toronto Engineering Society Council approved a resolution for a cost of living increase.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 2) The continuation of the **Blue Sky Solar Team** portion of the fee through the 2011-12 fall/winter academic period.

A referendum was held March 17-19, 2010, in which Applied Science & Engineering students were asked to support the continuation of the fee for the next two years. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble

The University of Toronto Blue Sky Solar Racing team is seeking support from fellow undergraduate students of the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering in renewing the team's levy funding. If granted, the fee of \$2.75 per fall and winter session (totaling \$5.50 per academic year) will be applied to all full-time undergraduate engineering students for the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 academic years.

Question

Are you in favour of the continuation of the student levy for the University of Toronto Blue Sky Solar Racing as indicated in the preamble? Yes/No

The results of the referendum are as follows:

In the course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students did not receive complaints concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.

- 3) The continuation of the **Concrete Canoe Team** portion of the fee through the 2011-12 fall/winter academic period.

A referendum was held March 17-19, 2010, in which Applied Science & Engineering students were asked to support the continuation of the fee for the next two years. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble

The University of Toronto Concrete Canoe (UTCC) team is seeking approval from the members of the Engineering Society to renew the current student levy that supports the team.

The UTCC team is an entirely undergraduate run team that designs, builds and races a canoe made out of concrete. Concrete mix design, aerodynamic hull design and stress analysis, as well as the logistics are integral parts of our team. UTCC provides the undergraduate community with an extracurricular way of achieving professional development, improved communications, and leadership skills. The team competes each year at the Canadian National Concrete Canoe Competition (CNCCC) with a dozen other schools from around the country.

Since the inception of this student levy two years ago, UTCC has made great efforts in improving many aspects of the team to remain competitive. Venues have been rented on and off campus, down by the waterfront, to facilitate the physical training of paddlers and to allow them to practice paddling in a canoe well before the competition. The finishing on each year's canoe has surpassed its predecessors; new and interesting techniques are continually explored to further enhance the canoe's aesthetic appeal. As well, the UTCC team continues to improve and advance in its research of materials in concrete applications, being the first to

experiment with the use of Expancel: a plastic polymer that has drastically improved the concrete mix. This year the UTCC was also invited to speak at the Concrete Precasters Association of Ontario's annual Convention and were greeted by many people from the industry willing to offer samples of materials for the team's testing purposes.

This levy will represent an estimated 66% of the UTCC team's budget. With this levy we do not need to approach the Engineering Society or discipline departments for funds allowing them to distribute them to other initiatives. With your continued support we will be able to carry on developing new and innovative concrete mixes and allow us the opportunity to expand in the coming years by publishing our results, improving our aerodynamic hull design, and improving the finished canoe. For next year we are investigating the possibility of constructing a fibre-glass prototype canoe to test the features of our design, as well as better quality control measures. Both of which would be made more possible with the funds from this levy.

The proposal is a continuation of the current student levy, \$1.625 per fall and winter session (totaling \$3.25 per academic year), applied to all full-time undergraduate engineering students for the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 academic years.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Engineering Society** fee be increased as follows: (a) an increase of \$0.27 per session in the Society portion of the fee for all full-time Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students; (b) continuation of the Blue

Sky Solar Team portion of the fee; and (c) continuation of the Concrete Canoe Team portion of the fee. If approved, the total Engineering Society fee will be increased to \$123.45 per session, charged to all full-time Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students. The fee for part-time students would remain unchanged at \$20.99.

Faculty of Information Studies Students Council (FISSC)

Background

In fall/winter 2009-10, the FISSC fee was \$50.00 per session for full-time Faculty of Information students (\$25.00 for part-time students). The entire fee is designated for a technology upgrade fund.

Request(s)

- 1) The introduction of a society portion of the fee for all Master of Information students beginning Fall 2010. The fee would be \$12.50 per session for full-time students (\$6.25 per session for part-time students).

A referendum was held February 22 to 24, 2010, in which Masters of Information students were asked to support proposal. The wording of the question is as follows:

All students registered in the Master of Information program are required to pay yearly Student Council Fees (as per article three (3) of the MISC Constitution); \$12.50 per session (no fee charged during the Summer Session) for full-time students (for a total of \$25.00 for fall/winter period) and \$6.25 per session (no fee charged during the Summer Session) for part-time students (for a total of \$12.50 for fall/winter period). In the past, it has been collected at a table stationed in the Bissell building during the first week of school. Since this method of collection was proved to be inefficient, the Master of Information Student Council would like to propose that this fee be automatically charged through ROSI at the beginning of each new school year.

THAT beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Faculty of Information Studies Students Council (FISSC)** fee be increased by \$12.50 per session (\$6.25 per session part-time) in order to establish a society portion of the fee. If approved, the total FISSC fee charged will be increased to \$62.50 per session for full-time students (\$31.25 for part-time students), charged to all Master of Information students.

Graduate Students' Union (GSU)

Background

The GSU fee has been \$209.72 per session for full-time graduate students (\$80.89 for part-time graduate students) since fall 2009. The fee includes \$28.95 per session for full-time students (\$14.48 per session for part-time students) for the society; \$7.32 per session for full-time students (\$3.66 per session for part-time students) designated for membership in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and CFS-Ontario (CFS-O); \$108.45 (including an administration fee and provincial sales tax) per session for Supplementary Health Coverage (full-time only); and \$60.50 (including an administration fee and provincial sales tax) per session for a Dental Plan (full-time and part-time).

In accordance with the original referendum question, the GSU may request increases to the Canadian Federations of Students (CFS) / Canadian Federation of Students-Ontario (CFS-O) levy by an amount identified by CFS/CFS-O upon approval of a resolution by

the Council of the GSU. Pursuant to approval by a previous referendum, requests for increases of less than or equal to industry indexes are permitted in the Supplementary Health Coverage and Dental Plan portions of the fee upon approval of a resolution by the Council of the GSU.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the Society's portion of the fee for full-time and part-time students.

At its meeting held on February 25, 2010, the Council of the GSU approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the society's portion of the fee for full-time and part-time graduate students.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 2) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 25, 2010, the Council of the GSU approved a resolution to request an inflationary increase to the CFS/CFS-O portion of the GSU fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 3) A decrease in the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 25, 2010, the Council of the GSU approved a resolution to request decrease to the Supplemental Health Coverage portion of the GSU fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 4) An increase in the Dental Plan portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on February 25, 2010, the Council of the GSU approved a resolution to request an inflationary increase to the Dental Plan portion of the GSU fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students

has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 5) An increase in the Supplementary Health Coverage Administrative Fee portion of the fee.

A referendum was held on March 23-25, 2010 in which full-time graduate students were asked to support the increase to the administrative fee. The wording of the question was as follows:

I agree to authorize the Graduate Students' Union to increase the administrative fee by 50 cents per session from all full-time graduate students (\$1. per academic year), on behalf of the Graduate Students' Union Health Insurance Plan effective September 1, 2010/ This would result in a total administrative fee for \$4.06 per year (\$2.03 per session). Yes / No.

Innis College Student Society (ICSS)

At its meeting on March 1, 2010, the Innis College Student Society approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the society's portion of the fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 2) The elimination of the Harold Innis Foundation portion of the fee.

At its meeting on March 1, 2010, the Innis College Student Society approved the elimination of the fee collected for the Harold Innis Foundation, pursuant to the anticipated dissolution of the Foundation.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

Erindale College Student Union (operating as the University of Toronto Mississauga Students' Union; UTMSU)

The fee includes \$12.71 per session designated for the society; \$48.60 per session for a Mississauga Transit UPass; \$0.93 per session for Academic Societies; \$1.00 per session for a Student Refugee Program; and \$0.50 per session for a Food Bank.

Pursuant to previous referenda, cost of living increases are permitted in the society, Academic Societies, Student Refugee Program, and Food Bank portions of the fee. Increases of up to 8% are permitted for the UPass portion of the fee pursuant to a 2007 referendum.

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the society portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 4, 2010, the Council of the UTMSU approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the society's portion of the fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students

has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 2) An inflationary increase to the Mississauga Transit UPass.

At its meeting held on March 4, 2010, the Council of the UTMSU approved a resolution to request an inflationary increase to the Mississauga Transit UPass portion of the fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 3) A cost of living increase for the Academic Societies portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 4, 2010, the Council of the UTMSU approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the Academic Societies portion of the fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

Recommendation:

THAT on the condition that the SCCR Board of Directors approve the resolution to seek the increase, beginning in the fall 2010 session, the **Scarborough Campus Community Radio (SCCR)** fee be increased by \$0.04 in the society portion of the fee. If approved, the total SCCR fee will be increased to \$3.59 per session, charged to all full-time University of Toronto at Scarborough students.

Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU)

Background

The SCSU fee has been \$165.56 per session for full-time students (\$11.98 per session for part-time students) since fall 2009. The fee includes \$23.63 per session (\$1.29 per session part-time) designated for the society; \$6.83 per session (full-time only) for membership in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and CFS-Ontario (CFS-O); \$34.50 per session (\$10.34 per session for part-time) for the UTSC Student Centre; \$0.75 per session (\$0.25 part-time) for a Refugee Student Program; \$47.11 (including an administration fee and provincial sales tax) per session for Supplementary Health Coverage (full-time only); and \$47.26 (including the administration fee and provincial sales tax) for the Dental Plan (full-time only).

Pursuant to approval by previous referenda, requests for cost of living increases in the society, CFS/CFS-O, and Student Centre portions of the fee are permitted upon approval of a resolution by the Board of SCSU. Pursuant to approval by previous referenda, requests for increases of less than or equal to 10% are permitted in the Accident and Prescription Drug Plan portion and the Dental Plan portion of the fee upon approval of a resolution by the Board of SCSU. The mandate to collect the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee ends this year (SCSU board approval is required for continuation).

Requests

- 1) A cost of living increase in the society portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on April 9, 2010, the Board of Directors of SCSU approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the society portion of the SCSU fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 2) A cost of living increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on April 9, 2010, the Board of Directors of SCSU approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the CFS/CFS-O portion of the SCSU fee.

Note: SCSU requested an increase in the CFS/CFS-O portion of fee of \$0.52 (7.6%). This amount exceeds the amount permitted under the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* (1.2%) without support of a referendum. An increase of 1.2% is recommended for approval below.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 3) A cost of living increase in the Student Centre portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on April 9, 2010, the Board of Directors of SCSU approved a resolution to request a cost of living increase to the Student Centre portion of the SCSU fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 4) Continuation of the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on April 9, 2010, the Board of Directors of SCSU approved a resolution to request continuation of the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee through the 2010-11 year.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 5) An inflationary increase in the Accident and Prescription Drug Plan portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on April 9, 2010, the Board of Directors of SCSU approved a resolution to request an inflationary increase to the Accident and Prescription Drug Plan portion of the fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students

has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 6) An inflationary increase in the Dental Plan portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on April 9, 2010, the Board of Directors of SCSU approved a resolution to request an inflationary increase to the Dental Plan portion of the fee.

In course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints concerning the process leading up to the request.

- 7) The establishment of a new designated portion of the fee for a UTSC Sports & Recreation Complex.

A referendum was held on March 17-19, 2010 in which all UTSC students were asked to support the establishment of the new designated portion of the fee. The wording of the question was as follows:

The Preamble:

The SCSU proposes to establish a new Special Levy representing the student contribution of \$30 million (being 18% of the total \$170 million capital costs -- all costs in 2008 figures) of the Pan Am Games legacy facilities to be located on University of Toronto Scarborough and adjacent City of Toronto lands. It is well known that physical and mental wellbeing are intricately related. A major sports and recreation complex will promote wellness and a healthy lifestyle amongst our students. In recognition for this investment and in concert with other partners, UTSC students will replace the current aging Recreation Centre built 38 years ago for 4000 students with one of the best University sports complexes in Canada built to International standards. This new Sports and Recreation Complex is expected to feature, amongst other facilities:

- *multi-purpose gymnasium*
- *fitness/cardio/weights/training centre*
- *sports medicine clinic*
- *200 metre indoor running track*
- *racquet sports*
- *teaching studios (dance fitness/martial arts)*
- *2 x 52 meter competition pool (with spectator seating)*

- 10 metre dive tank
- women-only spaces

In parallel, UTSC will pursue a plan to create a self-funded, covered all-season turf field and twin ice pad multi-venue arenas, which are envisioned as an additional but complementary part of the Complex.

Special Levy

The Special Levy is to be collected on behalf of the SCSU and provided by it to the University as the full and total UTSC student capital contribution to the new Sports & Recreation Complex. It will be compulsory and will be assessed per session but only for the sessions in which a student is registered as follows:

- Beginning in the Summer 2010 session, until and including the Winter 2014 session, \$40 per full-time student, and \$8 per part-time student, both increased annually at 4%, to assist with initial capital costs. All these contributions can be credited in full toward a future Alumni membership.
- Beginning in the Summer 2014 session, until and including the Summer 2039 session, \$140 per full-time student, and \$28 per part-time student, both increased annually at 4% over the course of a 25- year mortgage period (the period over which internal and/or external University financing will be required).

The Special Levy will be subject to University approval processes and will be irrevocable, and bind SCSU and its successors and will apply to all future full and part-time students registered during the specified time-frame.

The SCSU will also work with the UTSC administration to explore expansion of student activity space on campus, including the optimization of the use and assignment of existing spaces.

I am aware of one complaint which was submitted to SCSU but was ruled to be inadmissible because it was untimely. Without assessing the validity of that ruling, since the University is aware of the content of the complaint, this office has considered the general issue it attempted to raise. The Office of the Vice-Provost, Students is satisfied that there is no merit to the complaint. Accordingly, in light of the requirements of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* this request is found to be in compliance and the fee is recommended for approval.
