**HIGHLIGHTS:**

**1. Ontario Ministry of Labour (MOL) Visits and Orders**

During this reporting period (January 1 – March 31, 2016) the Ministry of Labour visited the St. George Campus four times, no orders were issued.

No critical injuries were reported during this period.

**2. Regulatory Visits**

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) Safeguards Division visited the radioactive waste facility and one laboratory at the St. George campus where reportable material under *Canada-IAEA Safeguards Agreement* (International Atomic Energy Agency) is located. Under this program, all activities involving any nuclear fuel cycle-related research are reportable to the CNSC Safeguard Division. No issues were reported.

### **3. Incidents Abroad Relating to Students**

The Safety Abroad Office has not been advised of any injuries related to students abroad from January 1 to March 31, 2016.

### **4. Summary**

In summary, based on the reports I have received through the operation of our occupational health and safety policy, and to the best of my knowledge, the University is in compliance with its health and safety obligations.
