Annual Report (2014-15): Committee on Standing, Office of the Registrar

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

Under section 5.7 of its terms of reference, the Academic Affairs Committee receives, annually from its assessors, reports on matters within its areas of responsibility, including statements of current issues, opportunities and problems, and recommendations for changes in policies, plans or priorities that would address such issues. The Committee receives, annually, from the appropriate administrators, reports on services within its areas of responsibility, including research and its subcommittee on academic appeals.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The annual report was provided for information to the Academic Affairs Committee on April 30, 2015.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The purpose of the information package is to inform the Committee of the Committee on Standing (COS) work and the matters it considers, and the process it follows. It is not intended to create a discussion regarding individual cases or their specifics, as they were dealt with by a body, which was bound by due process and fairness. The COS reviews all appeals for petitions decisions made by the Office of the Registrar.

The report covers the period between September 1, 2014 and August 31, 2015.

The report highlights various types of petitions assessed by the Office of the Registrar, totalling 6846 petitions in the given period. The most common petition type was the "other" petition with 2979 submitted (this is likely due to the CUPE strike in February 2015). A large proportion of these "other" petitions were either requests for or removals of credit/ no credit (CR/NCR). During the period being considered, the Office of the Registrar received petitions from 52 percent of the enrolment population, and 14 percent of these were deferred exams. The COS reviewed cases for 22 students, totalling 30 appeals.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no implications for the Campus operating budget.




University of Toronto Mississauga Petitions vs. Enrolment 2010-2015
