### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

## 1. Ontario Ministry of Labour (MOL) Visits and Orders

During this reporting period (April 1 – June 30, 2016) the Ministry of Labour visited the St. George Campus four times, no orders were issued.

Two critical injuries were reported during this period.

<ul> <li>An employee pinched a finger while moving a table (no broken bone and no bleeding), but lost consciousness shortly after due to the pain.</li> <li>An employee tripped and fell outside a building and was diagnosed with a fractured humerus. The uneven flooring at the entrance of the building that represented a trip hazard was repaired.</li> </ul>
<b>2. Regulatory Visits</b> The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) Safeguards Division visited the radioactive waste facility and one laboratory at the St. George campus where reportable material under <i>Canada-IAEA Safeguards Agreement</i> (International Atomic Energy Agency) is located. Under this program, all activities involving any nuclear fuel cycle-related research are reportable to the CNSC Safeguard Division. No issues were reported.
<b>3. Incidents Abroad Relating to Students</b> The Safety Abroad Office has not been advised of any injuries related to students abroad during this period.
<b>4. Summary</b> In summary, based on the reports I have received through the operation of our occupational health and safety policy, and to the best of my knowledge, the University is in compliance with its health and safety obligations.
