JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

HLTD25H3 Topics in Environmental Health

The didactic portion of this course will examine emerging environmental health issues using case studies. In the hands-on portion of the course, students will learn a range of research skills — how to use the Systematic Reviews and Meta-Analyses (PRISMA) guidelines, evidence-based health and best practices, and the different elements of a successful grant proposal — while, honing their researching, writing, and presenting skills.

Prerequisite: HLTC24H3 with a minimum GPA of 2.7 (B-) Enrolment Limits: 30 Breadth Requirement: Natural Sciences

Rationale:

HLTD25H3 will focus on emerging environmental health topics. Currently there are no other advanced undergraduate environmental health courses at UTSC, or at the wider UT. The proposed course therefore fills an academic gap in that new environmental health issues are always emerging. It also expands the D-level offerings focused on Population Health. There are no similar courses offered at UTSC, or the wider University.

The course is being proposed out of cycle so that it can be offered in Winter 2017.
