#### **ITEM IDENTIFICATION:**

Minor Undergraduate Curricular Modifications

#### JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

University of Toronto Scarborough Academic Affairs Committee (AAC) "is concerned with matters affecting the teaching, learning and research functions of the Campus" (*AAC Terms of Reference, Section 4*). Under section 5.6 of its terms of reference, the Committee is responsible for approval of "Major and minor modifications to existing degree programs." The AAC has responsibility for the approval of Major and Minor modifications to existing programs as defined by the University of Toronto Quality Assurance Process (*UTQAP, Section 3.1*).

#### **GOVERNANCE PATH:**

1. UTSC Academic Affairs Committee [For Approval] (September 14, 2017)

#### **PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:**

On February 28, 2017 the UTSC Academic Affairs Committee approved Minor Undergraduate Curricular changes to the Major (Joint) program in New Media Studies (BA).

#### HIGHLIGHTS:

On February 28, 2017, UTSC Academic Affairs Committee approved minor program modifications to the Major (Joint) Program in New Media Studies (BA), which is housed in the Department of Arts, Culture and Media (ACM).

The changes to the Major, implemented to be effective for the 2017-18 academic year, consisted of:

- 1. Adding ACMB01H3 as a required course to component 1 of the program requirements; total credits of the component increased from 1.0 to 1.5;
- 2. Decreasing the total credits of component 2 of the program requirements from 1.5 to 1.0 to be chosen from MDSB61H3, MDSB62H3, MDSB63H3; and
- 3. Removing components 3 and 4 of the program requirements, which reduced the total credits to complete program by 1.0 credit from 9.0 credits to 8.0 credits.

ACM and the Office of the Dean have discovered:

- 1. The program requirements, as they are described in the 2017-18 Academic *Calendar*, include that "Students must complete 8.0 credits of which at least 2.0 credits must be at the C- or D-level." However, the program's course components are comprised of 7.0 credits at the A- and B-level, and 1.0 credit at the D-level. A further 1.0 credit at the C- or D-level is missing from the program requirements making it impossible for students to complete.
- 2. The program no longer meets the UTSC Degree Criteria (2010), which mandates that a Major offering include a minimum of 2.0 credits at the C- or D-level.

The Dean's Office and ACM have consulted extensively and taken the following action:

- In the short term, to ensure students selecting the program as a Subject POSt in 2017-18 are able to complete its course components, and also that the program meets the UTSC Degree Criteria, the curricular changes approved on February 28, 2017 have been reversed in the online Academic *Calendar*, and in Degree Explorer. Thus, the requirements for the Major (Joint) Program in New Media Studies revert fully to the requirements in place in the 2016-17 academic year, except where courses codes and titles had been updated to reflect course changes approved for 2017-18. <u>These</u> <u>changes were implemented in the Academic *Calendar* and Degree Explorer on July 26, 2017, and are effective for the 2017-18 Academic Year.
  </u>
- 2. In the long term, ACM will conduct a thorough review of the program potentially resulting in future major modifications.

Students were apprised of the changes to the program through the Academic *Calendar*, the Department of Arts, Culture and Media, the Registrar's Office, and the Academic Advising and Career Centre.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

There are no net financial implications to the campus's operating budget.

THAT minor curricular modifications to the Major (Joint) program in New Media Studies, submitted by the Department of Arts, Culture and Media, as described in Undergraduate Minor Curriculum Modifications for Approval, Report 6, dated July 26, 2017, and recommended by the Vice-Principal Academic and Dean, Professor William Gough, be approved effective April 1, 2017 for the academic year 2017-18.

# 2017-18 Curriculum Cycle Undergraduate Minor Curriculum Modifications for Approval Report 6 July 26, 2017

### Department of Arts, Culture and Media

#### **Program Changes**

#### Major (Joint) program in New Media Studies (BA)

#### Overview of Changes:

- 1. Remove ACMB01H3 as a required course from component 1 of the program requirements;
- Revise component 2 of the program requirements such that MDSB61H3, MDSB62H3, MDSB63H3 are all required courses; total credits to complete this component changes from 1.0 credits to 1.5 credits;
- 3. Reinstate components 3 and 4 of the program requirements, as they appear in the 2016-17 Academic *Calendar*; the total credits to complete the program increases by 1.0 credit – from 8.0 credits to 9.0 credits.

#### Rationale:

On Tuesday February 28, 2017, UTSC Academic Affairs Committee approved minor program modifications to the Major (Joint) Program in New Media Studies (BA); these changes were implemented to be effective for the 2017-18 academic year.

The Department of Arts, Culture and Media (ACM), and the Office of the Dean have discovered:

- The program requirements, as they are described in the 2017-18 Academic *Calendar*, include that "Students must complete 8.0 credits of which at least 2.0 credits must be at the C- or D-level." However, the program's course components are comprised of 7.0 credits at the A- and B-level, and 1.0 credit at the D-level. A further 1.0 credit at the C- or D-level is missing from the course components making it impossible for students to complete the program.
