PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The annual report was provided for information to the Academic Affairs Committee on May 7, 2018.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The purpose of the information package is to inform the Academic Affairs Committee of the work of Committee on Standing (COS) specifically providing details concerning the focus of the work, the numbers of cases considered and the outcomes. It is not intended to create a discussion regarding individual cases or their specifics, as they were dealt with by a body, which was bound by due process and fairness. The COS reviews appeals for petitions decisions made by the Office of the Registrar.

The report covers the period between September 1, 2017 to August 31, 2018

The report highlights the types of petitions assessed by the Office of the Registrar, totaling 5840 in the given period.

COS met 8 times to review 62 appeals. 27 were granted, 34 were refused and 1 appeal was dismissed. Four cases were appealed to the Academic Appeals Subcommittee

From the Office of the Registrar


The University of Toronto Mississauga Office of the Registrar (OR) adjudicates petition requests on behalf of the Committee on Standing (COS) as well as manages the hearing of first appeals, of refused petitions, to the members of COS. The membership is comprised of faculty members at UTM. Representatives from the OR attend hearings in a non-voting capacity, with the exception of the Registrar and Director of Enrolment Management, who serves as the Chair of COS who is pleased to provide this summary report for September 1, 2017 to August 31, 2018.

Petitions and Committee on Standing - An Overview

The OR processed 5840 petition requests on behalf of the COS in 2017-2018. The largest number were for first deferrals of unwritten final examinations which comprised 40.5% of the requests. Students who are granted a first deferral of an exam are required to write it during the deferred examination period (which follows directly after the regular exam periods in April, June and August, but is scheduled in the February Reading Week for December regular exams).


Number of Petitions Processed vs. Enrolment



Regular and Deferred Exams

The OR scheduled 817 final examinations for the December, April, June and August regular exam period, preparing 88,750 individual scripts. An average of 17% of UTM's student population did no write their regular UTM examination and submitted a petition for an exam deferral to be written in the deferred examination period. Due to the university closure (weather related) during the 2018 April Regular Examination period, the number of April deferred exam petitions increased by 11%.

Committee on Standing Cases

The COS will review an appeal with new information (not presented in the original petition request) within 90 days of the original petition decision date. Appeals must be submitted in writing to the OR. All appeals are heard by the COS before the student can appeal to the UTM Academic Appeals Subcommittee.

Late Withdrawal without Academic Penalty (WDR) vs. Late Withdrawal after the Drop Deadline (LWD)

The decrease in LWDs in 2016-2017 may be attributed to change in deadline to request CR/NCR from the last day to drop a course from the academic record to the last day of classes for UTM students, which was made effective on May 1, 2016.

The low number of LWDs requested in 2014-2015 can be attributed to the academic provisions provided to students impacted by the CUPE 3902 strike in the Winter 2015 term. These provisions included the use of Credit/No Credit (CR/NCR) towards Subject POSt requirements, exemption from the maximum number of CR/NCR (2.0 credits) and extended request deadlines.
