ITEM IDENTIFICATION

University of Toronto Mississauga: Amendment to UTM Council Constitution

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION

Section 5.2.2 of the Academic Board's terms of reference calls for new or revised divisional constitutions to be considered by the Board, and confirmed by the Executive Committee. Amendments to By-laws are approved by divisional councils.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

The current Constitution of the University of Toronto Mississauga was approved by the Academic Board on May 8, 2003 (confirmed by Executive Committee of the Governing Council on May 20, 2003).

HIGHLIGHTS

The proposed changes to the University of Toronto Mississauga its Constitution are minor in nature and reflect name changes for various Council member organizations. In addition, the text has been made more consistent throughout the document. The listing below catalogs the changes proposed and the attached copy identifies the revisions:

- Section 1f) and g) and section 3: Text revised to be consistent with respect to references to the College as the University of Toronto at Mississauga or UTM, and to Erindale College Council as "the Council".
- Section 3 d): as a result of changes to the Erindale College Student Union's operations, such as its operation as the UTMSU (University of Toronto Mississauga Student Union).
- Section 3: Addition of the "Vice-Deans of UTM" to the membership list to accommodate an existing position and possible future additions.
- Section 3: Name change of the Association of Graduate Students of Erindale (AGSAE) to the University of Toronto Mississauga Association of Graduate Students (UTMAGS) as submitted to ECC by UTMAGS.

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- Section 3: Name change of the Associates of Erindale College to the Associates of the University of Toronto Mississauga as submitted to ECC by that organization.
- Section 4: Removal of the requirement that the Council meet three times per term. History has shown that there is not always sufficient business to warrant three Council meetings each term, so this section has been changed to require Council meet at least twice each term.
- Section 5: This section used to require ("will serve") the Chair and Vice-Chair to serve two consecutive two-year terms, so it has been revised to "may serve".
- Section 6: The Secretary's role in Council as a non-voting, ex-officio member has been clarified, as recommended in guidelines provided by the Governing Council Secretariat.

The amended Constitution of Erindale College Council (ECC) was approved by the ECC Executive Committee on February 26, 2009 and by the ECC on April 14, 2009.

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CONSTITUTION OF ERINDALE COLLEGE COUNCIL (University of Toronto at Mississauga)

- The Council of Erindale College (also known as the University of Toronto at Mississauga 1. (UTM)) hereafter referred to as "the Council", exercises its powers and duties under the University of Toronto Act, 1971, as amended. These powers and duties shall be to:
 - Develop policy regarding the academic affairs of UTM, subject to the approval of such policy, where approval is required by the Governing Council of the University of
 - Make rules and regulations for governing the proceedings of Council, including the (b) quorum necessary for conducting business;
 - Determine the composition and powers of the Council subject to the provisions of the (c) University of Toronto Act, 1971, as amended, and to the approval of Governing Council:
 - Determine the numbers, composition and authority of the committees of the Council; (d)
 - Award scholarships, bursaries, prizes and other awards in the gift of UTM;
 - (e) (f) Make recommendations to the Vice-President and Principal, UTM, on any matters of concern to the Council;
 - Ratify any amendments, changes or deletions to the Constitutions or By-laws of all (g) organizations operating as UTM student societies, provided that such amendments, changes or deletions are initiated only by these student societies, approved by their respective Councils and approved by the Executive Committee of the Council.
- 2. Elected and appointed members, with the exception of full-time undergraduate students who shall serve a term of one year, shall serve a term of two years, where possible. When necessary, elections to the Council shall be held in September and the results shall be brought to the Council for ratification at its first meeting after the election. The new Council shall assume office immediately following said meeting.

(a) 14 are to be elected from part-time undergraduate students;

by the following criteria:

- (b) 50 are to be elected from the full-time undergraduate students, all of whom must be full-time students:
- (c) The President of the Erindale Part-time Undergraduate Students (EPUS)
- (d) The President of the Erindale College Student Union (operating as the University of Toronto at Mississauga Students' Union, UTMSU) and up to 9 elected members of the ECSU Board of Directors
- 1 4. The Council shall meet at least two times per term in each of the fall and spring terms. A special meeting may be called by the Chair of the Council, or the Vice-President and Principal, UTM, or upon the written request of 25 members of the Council, and shall be convened within 14 days to consider matters requiring attention. Notice of the date and agenda of such meetings shall be given at least seven days prior to a meeting.
- A member of Council, elected by the Council, shall preside as Chair. The tenure of office of Chair shall be two years, subject to re-election. Council shall also elect a Vice-Chair. The Chair and Vice-Chair of Council may serve a maximum of two consecutive two-year terms.
- 6. The Secretary of the Council shall be appointed as a non-voting, ex-officio member by the Vice-President and Principal, UTM, in consultation with the Chair of the Council, to act as the Secretary of all Council and Standing Committee meetings.
- Meetings of the Council and the Committees of Council shall be open, except as otherwise provided in the By-laws approved by the Council.
- At least seven days' prior notice of the dates and agenda of the Council meetings shall be given to all members of the Council and to the UTM community. Decisions of the Council shall be published in such manner, as the Council, by By-law, shall determine.
- 9. The Council shall pass By-laws regulating the exercise of its powers and responsibilities and governing the calling and conduct of its meetings. By-laws and resolutions of the Council shall be published by the Council in such a manner as it may consider fit and they shall be open to examination by all members of UTM during normal business hours.
- The Council may appoint such standing and special committees as it may require in the conduct of its business and the fulfilment of its resolutions.

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- On approval by two-thirds of the voting members present at any meeting, the Council may recommend an amendment to its Constitution to the Governing Council of the University of Toronto. Fourteen days' notice of any proposed amendment shall be given to the College Council.
- 12. Revision:

This Constitution was revised on April 14th, 2009 by the Erindale College Council.

- 1. The Council of Erindale College, also known as the University of Toronto at Mississauga (UTM), hereafter referred to as "the Council," exercises its powers and duties under the University of Toronto Act, 1971, as amended. These powers and duties shall be to:
 - (a) develop policy regarding the academic affairs of UTM, subject to the approval of such policy, where approval is required by the Governing Council of the University of Toronto;
 - (b) make rules and regulations for governing the proceedings of Council, including the quorum necessary for conducting business;
 - (c) determine the composition and powers of the Council subject to the provisions of the University of Toronto Act, 1971, as amended, and to the approval of Governing Council;
 - (d) determine the numbers, composition and authority of the committees of the Council;
 - (e) award scholarships, bursaries, prizes and other awards in the gift of UTM;
 - (f) make recommendations to the Vice-President and Principal, UTM, on any matters of concern to the College Council;
 - (g) ratify any amendments, changes or deletions to the Constitutions or By-laws of all organizations operating as Erindale College (UTM) student societies, provided that such amendments, changes or deletions are initiated only by these student societies, approved by their respective Councils and approved by the Executive Committee of Erindale College Council.
- 2. Elected and appointed members, with the exception of full-time undergraduate students who shall serve a term of one year, shall serve a term of two years, where possible. When necessary, elections to the Council shall be held in September and the results shall be brought to the Council for ratification at its first meeting after the election. The new Council shall assume office immediately following said meeting.

- (c) The President of the Erindale Part-time Undergraduate Students (EPUS) or his/her designate;
- (d) The President of ECSU and up to 9 ECSU Directors

The President of the Association of Graduate Students and Assistants at Erindale (AGSAE) and 4 graduate student members appointed by AGSAE

- 2 post-doctoral fellows or research associates to be appointed by the Vice-Principal, Research 2 members of the Alumni of Erindale College appointed by the UTM Alumni Association (UofTMAA)
- 2 members of the Associates of Erindale College appointed by the Associates of Erindale College
- Up to 5 retired members of the UTM teaching staff appointed by the Vice-President and Principal
- 4. The Council shall meet at least three times per term in each of the fall and spring terms. A special meeting may be called by the Chair of the Council, or the Vice-President and Principal, UTM, or upon the written request of 25 members of the Council, and shall be convened within 14 days to consider matters requiring attention. Notice of the date and agenda of such meetings shall be given at least seven days prior to a meeting.
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- 10. The Council may appoint such standing and special committees as it may require in the conduct of its business and the fulfilment of its resolutions.
- On approval by two-thirds of the voting members present at any meeting, the Council may recommend an amendment to its Constitution to the Governing Council of the University of Toronto. Fourteen days' notice of any proposed amendment shall be given to the College Council.
