**MOTION** ( / ) **THAT** SGS Council approve the proposal to establish an Opera option, within the existing Performance field of the Master of Music Program, effective September 2002.

#### NOTE:

Division I Executive Committee at its meeting of November 8, 2002 approved this proposal. The Calendar description of this option discussed at Division I Executive states: Performance (opera): In addition to applied instruction, four full courses are required. These include one full course in music literature (MUS 4200Y, taken in the first year), Advanced Performance Studies (MUS 4602Y, taken in the second year) and two full courses in Operatic Studies (MUS 4900Y and 4901Y). Performance in operatic productions will be evaluated by a committee and assigned grades under Operatic Role I (MUS 4966Y) and Operatic Role II (MUS 4988Y).

With SGS Council approval, this item will go to Governing Council committees for approval or for information and to the Ontario Council on Graduate Studies for information.

On November 8, 2001, the Executive Committee of Division I approved a proposal from the Graduate Department of Music to include a new Opera option in our already-existing Master's program in Performance. Today, we are providing some background, the rationale, and a brief description of the option.

## 1. Background

The Graduate Department of Music offers master's and doctoral degrees in musicology, composition and music education. The Master's degree in performance is a long-established program for instrumentalists and singers. Three years ago, we added an option in conducting. The present proposal is to add an opera option within the Master's program in performance.

The Opera diploma program at the Faculty of Music is the premier training ground for young opera singers in Canada. We have a superb facility in the Macmillan Theatre, and a team of first-rate instructors in every aspect of operatic performance. The musical director/conductor of the program, along with the stage director and key members of the musical staff, are members of the Graduate Department of Music. In effect, the facilities and staffing for the proposed option are already in place.

#### 2 Rationale

The aim of the new option is to allow young opera singers who are academically talented and qualified to pursue their studies within the context of an established degree program. This requires only minor changes to the already existing Master's program in Performance (Voice).

### 3. Description

The new option is designed to be very similar to the current Master's program, and one half of the courseload is identical to it. The other courses have been renumbered to reflect the unique qualities of the Opera option.
