ITEM IDENTIFICATION:

School of Graduate Studies: Proposal for the Department of Speech-Language Pathology to change the admission requirements to the Master of Science degree program.

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The Committee has authority to approve minor changes to admission policies and practices of individual programs.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

HIGHLIGHTS:

The proposed change results in eliminating the current distinction between candidates to the degree program entering either with or without a background in Speech-Language Pathology. This change would make all candidates for the M.Sc. degree (with thesis) equal so that all entrants will be required to complete a one-year residency.

FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

There are no new/additional financial resources required to implement the program change. The changes to the programs are planned to be included into the SGS Calendar for 2004-2005.

Speech-Language Pathology

To: Division IV Executive

From: Luigi Girolametto, Coordinator of Graduate Studies, Speech-Language Pathology

The Graduate Department of Speech-Language Pathology is proposing a change to admission requirements to the Masters of Science (with thesis) degree.

When we set up our Master's of Science Degree Program (with thesis) it was anticipated that candidates without a background in Speech-Language Pathology should be required to complete a two-year residency. Those with a background complete a one-year residency.

Their course work includes prerequisites from Year 1 of the professional master's degree program (decided by supervisory committee). In the second year of residency, students complete the full requirements of the Master's of Science Program (i.e., two full courses, attendance at research work groups, thesis).

The department is proposing that we drop the distinction between candidates with and without a background in Speech-Language Pathology because (a) it is unattractive to potential applicants, (b) the extra course work makes it a very intensive master's degree program, (c) the current faculty do not believe it's necessary to require applicants without a background in Speech-Language Pathology to take professional degree courses because they are not able to practice as professionals anyway.

This change would make all candidates for the Master's of Science degree (with thesis) equal.

In in speech-language pathology is a plorat graduate program that may be a full time or part-time basis. The lam of the program is the development inelytical and evaluative approach to the post of speech-language pathology.

Graduates are prepared to assume varied professional responsibilities including the assessment, treatment, and management of speech, voice, language, and swallowing disorders. Course work and clinical internships are integrated and sequenced. There is a strong research to practice focus, and students complete a comprehensive portfolio requirement in their final year.

Admission Requirements

If an applicant finds it impossible to take the TOEFL, TWE, and TSE, the Department will accept one of the following:

1 the Michigan English Language Assessment Bettery (MELAB) with a minimum score of 85; 2 the international English Language Testing System (IELTS) with a minimum score of 8.0.

In addition to the proficiency test, applicants may be requested to attend a personal meeting with members of the Graduate Department of Speech-Language Pathology where their mastery of oral English for meeting clinical requirements will be assessed.

Candidates for the full-time and the part-time programs must submit applications by midJanuary. Check the departmental Web site for the exact application deadline. All applications for the M.H.Sc. program must be obtained directly from the Ontario Universities Application Centre in Guelph, Ontario (Inviv.ouac.on.ca/

Program Requirements
The professional M.H.Sc.

The professional M.H.Sc. program is divided into 5 academic and 4 clinicel units. Each academic unit is made up of topic-related courses. Teaching within and agross units emphasizes integrated learning experiences.

Academic units are followed by full-fime clinical placements. Each placement lasts between 4 and 10 weeks for a folat of 31 weeks of clinical experience throughout the 2 year M.H.Sc. program. Students must accept placements offered to them and are responsible for all travel and accommodation costs. Candidates enrolled in the full-time program must complete all requirements within two consecutive years.

Part-time students must choose one of three options for program completion; four-year, five-year, or six-year. Each option includes a prescribed sequence of academic and clinical units that must be followed. Part-time students must complete clinical units on a full-time basis (five days per week).

The M.H.Sc. program does not have a thesis requirement however, all M.H.Sc. students will be required to complete a portfolio that demonstrates proficiency in key areas of professional practice, including application of research principles, prior to graduation.

Degree of Master of Science

The Master of Science (MiSc.) degree is a fulltime program that prepares students to engage in the scientific study of normal and disordered speech and language processes in children and

The M.Sc. degree in speech-language pathology is a research-oriented program and does not prepare students for clinical practice. Altholigh the primary objective of the M.Sc. program is to prepare students for doctoral studies in speech and language sciences, successful completion of the program does not guarantee entrance into the Ph.D. program.

Admission Requirements

Students with a four-year degree, or its equivalent, in speech-larguage pathology or a related discipline, are considered for exhitsion according to the general admission critaria of the School of Graduale Studies. Prior to admission, an applicant must identify a faculty member who has agreed to serve as research supervisor. The research supervisor may want to examine a completed thesis and/or manuscripts and university transcripts. Application and September 15 for September registration. Applicants who were educated outside Canada, whose primary language is not English, and who graduated from a university where the language of instruction was not English, must demonstrate facility in the English language through the successful completion of one of the English proficiency tests listed in this calender. See General Regulations, English Language Facility.

Reclassification Examination

Master of Science candidates who demonstrate outstanding potential for advanced research in the discipline may be recommended by their supervisory committee for a raclassification examination which, when passed, allows them direct advancement to the Doctor of Philosophy program. This examination normally is undertaken following the completion of at least one season and within 18 months of registration in the M.Sc. program.

Program Requirements

1 Candidates with a background in speechlanguage pathology

The program requires a one-year residency period which typically is sufficient for completion of the course vork. Course requirements are determined by the student's supervisory committee. Normally, the cardidate is required to complete satisfactorily a minimum of two full courses, consisting of at least one full course in the area of research interest. In addition, students are required to participate in student and faculty research seminars. Students are required to engage in a research project, present the results in a written thesis, and complete a successful oral defence of the thesis.
