MOTION (/) **THAT** SGS Council approve the program requirement change to the Master of Arts Program of the Centre for the Study of Drama, as detailed below, effective September 2003.

Proposal:

That candidates for the M.A. degree be required to complete at least four full-course equivalents in Drama, as approved by the Centre, with at least one full-course equivalent in the history of theatre and performance and at least one-half course in the dramatic literature of a non-English-speaking culture.

Re: Calendar changes, rationale

Rationale:

We are eliminating DRAMA 1000Y as a full year course, splitting it into two half courses. Presently this course has enrolments of 20 to 25 students, dissatisfying to both students and faculty. The character of courses across campus has changed in the decades since this course was created, and theatre historical methodology is used widely. We will create a list of such courses each year, from which students can choose (including the two half courses formerly comprising 1000Y). This will serve the same function as DRA1000Y, but more evenly distribute enrolments.

Revised Calendar Entry:

Degree of Master of Arts Candidates are required:

1 to complete at least four full-course equivalents, as approved by the Centre, including at least one full-course equivalent in the history of theatre, and at least one half-course in the dramatic literature of a non-English-speaking culture;

2 to spend at least one Winter Session or twelve months in full-time study, or the equivalent in part-time work;

3 to satisfy the Centre's requirements of practical work in the theatre.
