REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF A NEW NON-GRADE COURSE REPORT

TRF – Program Transfer: Assigned by the School of Graduate Studies to a continuing research/ seminar course begun but not completed in the first program and will not be required in the new program to which a student has been officially transferred.

This new non-grade course report is required by SGS for administrative purposes. Currently when a student is granted permission to transfer from one SGS program to another and has a research/seminar course on his or her record that will not be completed, and will not be required in the new program, the research/seminar course appears on the transcript with the non-course report IPR – In progress. The new non-grade course report of TRF – Program Transfer- is required in order to indicate on the transcript that the student has officially transferred to a new program and is not expected to complete the research/seminar course in question.
