University of Toronto at Scarborough: Proposed Major (Co-operative) Program in Computer Science

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The Committee has authority for approval of changes to curriculum within established degree programs that can be accomplished with existing resources and are not major, as in specialist, major and minor programs in arts and science.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

HIGHLIGHTS:

The University of Toronto at Scarborough (UTSC) is proposing a new Major (Co-operative) Program in Computer Science, effective 2006-2007. The program description, rationale for the program, admission requirements, and learning outcomes are outlined in the attached documentation.

The Specialist Co-op program in Computer Science at UTSC, offered to students since 1988, has a well-established reputation among students and employers in the GTA. UTSC proposes to extend the program to students enrolled in the Major Program in Computer Science.

The proposal was approved by the UTSC Academic Committee at its meeting on December 6, 2005 and has been reviewed by the Tri-Campus decanal committee.
