Capital Project: Project Planning Report for the University of Toronto Mississauga Phase 4 of the Renovation of Biology Undergraduate Teaching Laboratories – Sources of Funding and Total Project Cost

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The Project Planning Report and the project scope of Phase 1 of the UTM Teaching Laboratories Renovation was approved in principle by the Governing Council on December 15, 2011.

The UTM Campus Council, at its meeting of December 9, 2013 considered and recommended this proposal for approval.

HIGHLIGHTS:

This item anticipates that the motion to approve in principle the Project Planning Report for the Renovation of Biology Undergraduate Teaching Laboratories at the University of Toronto Mississauga, dated October 21, 2013, has been approved. As well, it is anticipated that the project scope totalling approximately 598 gross square metres or about the same net assignable square meters (nasm) has also been approved in principle.

The estimated Total Project Cost for this project will be funded from Capital Reserves derived from the UTM Operating Budget. While the government funds provide about 70% of the total cost of the consolidated projects, individual elements are actually paid from different sources depending upon the timing of the specific project and related cash requirements compared with the cashflow from the government (spread over the four years, 2012/13 to 2015/16).

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

a) Total Project Cost Estimate

The proposed Total Project Cost (TPC) for Phase 4 of the Renovation of Biology Undergraduate Teaching Laboratories at the University of Toronto Mississauga, is \$4,578,872.

b) Operating Costs

We foresee that the cost of utilities in the renovated area will be reduced or remain the same because the number of Fume Hoods will be reduced and modern electronic BAS system such as Aircuity (used on the 4th floor) will be used to ventilate the room in a safe and efficient manner.

Due to the increased usage of these laboratories, it will be necessary to allow for increased cleaning costs associated with the maintenance of these areas. It is anticipated that these costs will increase from their current level of \$ 25,300 per annum to approximately \$ 43,300 per annum.
