PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The wording that appears on the University of Toronto parchment acknowledging student participation in a Joint Educational Placement for Doctoral Studies was approved by AP&P at the meeting held on Tuesday May 14, 2013.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The Joint Educational Placement option for full-time doctoral students has been in place since 2011. In keeping with the University's priorities around international student experience, the Joint Educational Placement Agreement template has recently been streamlined to make it easier for faculty, students and administrators to establish high quality Joint Educational Placements. The revised template also acknowledges that two parchments may be issued to students completing Joint Educational Placements.

Consultation on the template updates was broad and included the Council of Graduate Deans, the Office of Convocation, the Office of the Vice President – International and the Office of the Vice Provost, Academic Programs. All supported the updates.

Section D: Thesis and Final Oral Examination

A JEP student must meet the thesis requirements of the lead institution.

Notwithstanding those requirements, the thesis must conform to the regulations of the School of Graduate Studies, University of Toronto. The thesis shall constitute a written piece of original scholarship. It must be a significant contribution to the knowledge of the field and must be based on research conducted while registered in the doctoral program. A thesis should have a coherent topic with an introduction presenting the general theme of the research and a conclusion summarizing and integrating the major findings. Nonetheless, it may contain a collection of several papers. The collection of papers may be expanded or supplemented by unpublished material, scholarly notes, and necessary appendices. In all theses, pagination should be continuous; there should be a common table of contents and an integrated bibliography for the whole thesis. The thesis should normally be written in English, but with the permission of the School, a graduate unit may permit, or require, students in that unit to write the thesis in French. The thesis must be published on T-Space and deposited with Library and Archives Canada.

By accepting admission to the University of Toronto, the JEP student agrees to abide by all relevant University of Toronto and School of Graduate Studies policies and regulations, including but not limited to the <u>Code of Student Conduct</u>, <u>Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters</u>, <u>Policy on Ethical Conduct in Research</u> and <u>Policy and Procedures: Sexual Harassment</u>. Any instance of violation of these policies must be reported by the Chair or designate to both institutions. Regardless of where the misconduct occurs, the regulations of the University of Toronto apply.



In the event that the supervisory relationship at either institution breaks down, the Department Chair or designate will make reasonable efforts to assist the student in finding an alternative supervisor, provided that the student is in good standing and in accordance with U of T policies and procedures, etc. In the event of any disruption that is a "force majeure" (any of the following: an act of God, fire, governmental order, court order, civil disturbance, act of public enemy, embargo, war, work stoppage or labour dispute) in the academic activity at either institution, the student's study will revert to the other.

The JEP Agreement may be terminated at any time. In that instance, the student will no longer be considered as a Joint Placement degree student at the lead institution and would then be subject to the policies and regulations governing any regular degree student.
