UTSC Past and Present

- University of Toronto Scarborough (UTSC) founded in 1964,
 - first full-time students enrolled in 1965
- Back then, UTSC was home to 16 faculty members and 500 students.
- Today, we have more than 10,000 students and over 600 faculty and staff— with half of this growth happening in the last seven years.
- UTSC is now a vibrant U of T campus with its own strong student culture and impact felt at many levels: locally, nationally and around the world.



UTSC Past and Present

- 9 Principals since 1964
- In 2004, UTM and UTSC Principals became U of T VPs. This org change recognized:
 - the operational complexity and scope of leadership required for UTM and UTSC.
 - the importance of system coordination and strategy
 - As stand alone full service campuses, UTSC and UTM have on-site responsibilities that are similar to any Ontario mid-sized university.

Current State: Undergrad/Graduate Programs

Undergraduate

- 3 U of T campuses are operationally independent have different programs, can develop new programs, determine program intake levels and hire faculty
- High school admission applications to U of T campuses are processed as 3 separate Ontario University applications

Graduate

- Graduate programs are tri-campus: St George campus is typically administrative and educational home base
- Future--UTSC home base for Masters and limited number of new PhD programs



Case for Planning

- Student expansion largely non-targeted/incremental at UTSC
- tri-campus model represents important value-added for U of T
 - diversification with some campus differentiation will be key to realizing this added value for U of T
- Competition in higher education marketplace
 - Interesting to note—some Ontario Universities are investing in expansion into, or near to, the GTA area.
- Anticipated growth in Ontario university enrolment

Looking Forward: Priorities

- Vision and Identity for coming years
 - more targeted approach with an eye towards differentiation and 3 campus coordination
- Internal & external relations
 - community presence and U of T identity in east Toronto, GTA and surrounding regions
- Sustained focus on strategy and planning
- Increase partnerships and campus profile



Strategic Themes

Enhanced graduate training

- UTSC expansion of onsite graduate training at the Masters and PhD levels to 10 percent of the total student population by 2030
- Selective graduate growth in Masters and limited number of on-site PhD programs.

New & emerging areas at the undergraduate level

- responsive to student demand and interest
- differentiated undergrad programs with an emphasis on interdisciplinary and discipline-based learning elements
- Examples of new interdisciplinary programs: Health Studies, City Studies, International Development Studies



Strategic Themes

Internationalism

- UTSC will become an international hub for learning and partnership within the U of T system.
- Expansion of Green Path Green Path goes global?
- First year study abroad
- Targeting international students for future growth

Experiential learning

- Bridging theory and practice
- pedagogical trends
- coordinated and phased-in approach to comprehensive co-op programming (building on strengths e.g. BBA)
- community college partnerships
- International element (building on IDS)

Strategic Themes

Sustainable university platform

- Current UTSC projections—capacity to grow to 15,000 students.
- Major focus for planning will be to address the full capital, faculty and staff requirements needed to sustain current and future student numbers
