

University Decision Making




UofT Tri-Campus Governance Structure






The Establishment of UTSC Campus Council and its Committees

- The UTSC Campus Council and its Standing Committees was established in 2013 to improve governance oversight on all three campuses;
- The governance processes are aimed at enhancing campus-based decision-making and accountability;
- The Council is comparable to a Board of Governing Council and comprise representatives of the five estates: teaching staff, students, administrative staff, librarians, community members [LGIC, alumni, etc.].








Guidelines on Attendance at Meetings

Open Open to members of the University, the public, the media, up to room capacity. Most governance bodies Session meet in open session. • Restricted to members of the governance body and Closed individuals whose presence is considered by the body to be necessary (normally members of the Session administration). A motion is needed to move from open to closed session. • A meeting or part of a meeting may be held *in camera* where "intimate financial or personal matters of any In Camera person may be disclosed." (By-law Number 2). A motion is needed to go into *in camera*.
