Types of fraud and risks

- Incoming credentials
 - Risk of admitting unqualified students; displacing qualified applicants; harm classroom experience
- Outgoing credentials
 - Reputational risk; harm to other institutions
- Immigration Fraud
 - Reputational risk; national interest
- All post-secondary institutions are dealing with the same issues



Incoming Credentials

- Falsified university transcripts
 - Most often "from" other Canadian universities
- Falsified or inflated high school credentials
 - Private Ontario high schools
- Inaccurate information on application
 - Harder to detect; sometimes related to previous postsecondary or citizenship
- Fraudulent test scores
 - Compromised test sites



- The use of falsified U of T transcripts or diplomas to gain admission to other universities or for employment
 - May be entirely fraudulent or alteration of actual transcript
- Generally purchased from sophisticated organizations or <u>diploma mills</u>

Risk Mitigation – incoming

- Trained, experienced admissions staff and robust processes
 - Al pattern detection project
 - Residency verification via T-Card process
- ARUCC "doc alert"
- Advocacy work with COU on private schools file



Risk Mitigation – incoming

- Work with testing agencies, e.g., photo confirmation
- Increasing prevalence of digital data exchange (e.g., OUAC in Ontario, vendors like Naviance and Parchment in international schools)
- Association of Registrars of Universities and Colleges of Canada (ARUCC): Groningen Project



Risk Mitigation – outgoing

- Implementation of secure PDF transcript
- ARUCC Groningen Project
- Degree verification site
- Online verification of other documents



Risk Mitigation – Immigration Fraud

IRCC batch verification process

- Working relationship with Canada Border Services
 - Substantial numbers of fraudulent documents confirmed annually
- Online document verification services
