ITEM IDENTIFICATION: Student Societies: Requests for Fee Increases - University of Toronto St. George and Multi-Campus

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

Section 5 of the University Affairs Board Terms of Reference list student societies and compulsory non-academic incidental fees among the Board's areas of responsibility.

Sections 5.2.1 and 5.2.2 provide that compulsory non-academic incidental fees for representative student committees and divisional student societies "are approved by the Board."

GOVERNANCE PATH:

1. University Affairs Board [For Approval] (April 27, 2020)

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

Requests for changes to existing fees and/or the establishment of new fees are brought forward to the Board on one or more occasions each year.

HIGHLIGHTS:

In the attached document, the following student societies have requested changes to fees charged on their behalf by the University:

Student Societies: Requests for Fee Increases – University of Toronto St. George and Multi-Campus

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FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

There are no direct financial implications for the University's operating budget.

RECOMMENDATION:

BE IT RESOLVED

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students** fee be increased as follows:

(a) an increase of \$0.09 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee.

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Engineering Society** fee be changed as follows:

- (a) an increase of \$0.55 per fall and winter sessions in the Society portion of the fee (\$0.52 part-time & PEY);
- (b) the establishment of \$0.34 per fall session and \$0.33 per winter session in the Canadian Federation of Engineering Students portion of the fee for full-time, parttime, and PEY students through 2021-22;
- (c) an increase of \$0.23 per fall and winter sessions in the Human-Powered Vehicle Design portion of the fee through 2021-22 (full-time only);
- (d) the continuation of the Skule Endowment Fund portion of the fee through 2021-22; and
- (e) the continuation of, and an increase of \$0.05 per fall and winter sessions in, the Skule Night portion of the fee through 2021-22 (full-time only).

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Faculty of Music Undergraduate Association** fee be changed as follows:

- (a) the continuation of, and a decrease of \$50.00 per fall and winter sessions in, the Endowment Fund portion of the fee through 2024-25; and
- (b) the continuation of the Special Projects Fund portion of the fee through 2024-25.

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Master of Information Student Council** and **Museum Studies Student Association** fees be changed as follows: (a) a decrease of \$5.00 per fall and winter sessions in the Tech Fund/Tech Levy portion of the fees (\$2.50 part-time).

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the University College Literary and Athletic Society fee be changed as follows:

(a) an increase of \$0.24 per fall and winter sessions in the society portion of the fee (\$0.08 part-time).

Subject to confirmation of approval of the following fee change requests by the General Council of the University of Toronto Graduate Students' Union at its April 28, 2020 meeting,

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the University of Toronto Graduate Students' Union fee be changed as follows:

- (a) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$0.66 per session in the society portion of the fee (\$0.33 parttime);
- (b) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$0.01 per session in the Bikechain portion of the fee (full-time students only);
- (c) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$0.17 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee (<u>up to</u> \$0.09 per fall session and <u>up to</u> \$0.08 per winter session part-time);
- (d) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$0.06 per session in the Centre for Social Justice OPIRG portion of the fee (<u>up to</u> \$0.04 per fall session and <u>up to</u> \$0.02 per winter session part-time);
- (e) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$0.01 per session in the Sexual Education Centre portion of the fee (<u>up to</u> \$0.01 per fall session part-time);
- (f) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$11.64 per fall and winter sessions in the Health Plan portion of the fee; and
- (g) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$8.04 per fall and winter sessions in the Dental Plan portion of the fee.

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **University of Toronto Students' Union** (legally, the Students' Administrative Council) fee be changed as follows:

- (a) an increase of \$0.41 per session in the society portion of the fee;
- (b) an increase of \$0.01 per session in the Bikechain portion of the fee;
- (c) an increase of \$0.18 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee;
- (d) an increase of \$0.07 per session in the Downtown Legal Services portion of the fee;
- (e) an increase of \$0.02 per session in the Student Refugee Program portion of the fee;
- (f) an increase of \$10.21 per fall and winter sessions in the Health Plan portion of the fee;
- (g) an increase of \$8.53 per fall and winter sessions in the Dental Plan portion of the fee; and
- (h) the establishment of \$1.00 per session in the Student Aid Program Fund portion of the fee.

Subject to confirmation of approval of the following fee change requests by the University of Toronto Students' Union Board of Directors at its April 28, 2020 meeting, THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **University of Toronto Students' Union** fee be changed as follows:

(a) an increase of <u>up to</u> \$2.99 per session in the Student Commons Capital Levy portion of the fee.

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Varsity Publications** fee be changed as follows:

- (a) an increase of \$0.02 per session in the society portion of the fee (graduate); and
- (b) an increase of \$0.06 per session in the society portion of the fee (undergraduate).

Re:	Student Society Proposals for Fee Changes: University of Toronto St. George and Multi-Campus

The Office of the Vice-Provost, Students (OVPS) has received a number of fee change requests from student societies. The applications have been reviewed in light of the requirements of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees*, are found to be in compliance with these requirements, and are recommended for approval.

Requests for fee increases from student societies must meet a number of requirements. Section B.4. of the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* outlines the University's general expectations:

Requests to change the fee collected on behalf of a student society and requests for new fees shall be approved only when evidence has been presented that the request has been authorized by due constitutional process in the organization. The procedures to request approval of a new fee or an increase to an existing fee shall be published in the Handbook for Student Societies.

Cost-of-Living Increases

(a) Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is not greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices for Ontario as measured by Statistics Canada (December-over-December) as of December 31 of the previous year, the request must be supported by the results of a previous referendum approving the principle of a cost-of-living adjustment. In special circumstances (e.g., when a portion of a student society fee is designated for a health plan or capital project), other inflation indexes or predetermined inflation factors may be used, provided that the request is supported by the results of a previous referendum approving the principle of a cost-of-living adjustment.

Referendum Requirement

(b) Where the amount of an increase in the fee charged is greater than the year-over-year change in consumer prices, the request must be supported by the majority of the society's members voting in a recent referendum.

The procedures for handling fee change requests (from the *Handbook for Student Societies* published by the OVPS) also provide that requests for a fee increase must be supplied with the following:

Evidence that the request to change the existing fee (or to institute a new charge) has been authorized by due constitutional process of the organization. This evidence should include a copy of or specific reference to the section of the society's constitution which related to the mechanism for fee changes, minutes of the meeting at which the resolution to request the change was passed, details and results of any referenda related to the subject which may have been held within the division, and publicity given the matter to ensure that those who may be affected by the change are aware of the proposal, including size and purpose of the increase, and have had the opportunity to make their views known.

Normally, the administration intersects with these processes at two points. Initially, student societies may seek advice from the OVPS on the wording of the referendum questions (with respect to clarity and technical language). The second point occurs after the referendum when the student society makes the formal request for a fee increase. The recommendation for approval is derived from the assessment of whether or not the society has met the requirements established in the *Policy* and relevant procedures.

Occasionally, the OVPS is asked to look into complaints about referendum procedures and compliance with relevant portions of the society's constitution and/or by-laws. The results of these investigations play a significant role in the assessment of the request and the recommendation for approval.

The assessment of requests for fee increases is normally based upon the following expectations:

- 1. The student society must make the request in a manner consistent with the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the University's procedures for increases to student society fees;
- 2. When required, there must be a positive result in a referendum for a fee increase (special conditions established by the society's by-laws, such as quorum, must also be met);
- 3. The referendum question itself should be clear and provide enough information to students in order to gain a full understanding of the implications of the question and proposed fee for them;
- 4. The referendum must be held in a fair manner, advertised and promoted in a reasonable manner, and the members of each organization should be given a reasonable opportunity to vote; and
- 5. Each organization must comply with the provisions of its own by-laws, rules of procedure, and specific policies and procedures approved by the society's board or council.

Societies which have previously received approval (by referendum) from their members for an annual cost-of-living increase in the society's portion of the fee may request increases, upon approval by the society's board or council, of up to the previous Ontario December-over-December cost-of-living increase (consumer price index) calculated by Statistics Canada. The December 2019 consumer price index for Ontario was 2.1%.

As outlined in the excerpt from the *Policy* above, where members of a society have given consent (through a previous referendum) to the concept of inflationary increases according to a specific inflation factor or measure, this inflation factor may be used. For example, the Association of Part-Time Undergraduate Students (APUS), the University of Toronto Graduate Students' Union (UTGSU), and the University of Toronto Students' Union (UTSU) may request increases in the designated portions of their fees for health and dental plans at a rate established by approval of a previous referendum. APUS and the UTSU may request increases in their health and dental plan fees of up to 10%. The UTGSU may request increases in its health and dental plan fees of an amount less than or equal to a health industry index.

It is important to note that when dealing with a student society request for a fee change, it is the society's own constitution, by-laws, or established policies that set the standards for acceptable results in referenda. In some cases, society constitutions establish a minimum voter turnout in order to consider a referendum result to be valid. The University has not established additional criteria with respect to valid referendum voter turnout.

In addition, with respect to both requests for increases based upon the results of a referendum, and increases which require only the approval of the society's board or council, the administration relies on the assurances of student societies that due constitutional processes and fair procedures have been followed.

New or Continuing Fees and Increases Requiring a Referendum

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Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS)

Background

In 2019-20, the APUS fee was \$150.68 per fall and winter sessions, charged to all part-time undergraduate students on all campuses. The fee included:

• \$4.10 per session for the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee.

Request

1. A cost-of-living increase in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee. At its meeting held on March 10, 2020, the APUS Board of Directors approved a resolution to request a cost-of-living increase to the dedicated Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee.

In the course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints.

Summary of Changes

Recommendation

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students** fee be increased as follows:

(a) an increase of \$0.09 per session in the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) portion of the fee.

If approved, the total APUS fee will be \$150.77 per fall and winter sessions, charged to all part-time undergraduate students on all campuses.

Engineering Society (EngSoc)

Background

In 2019-20, the EngSoc fee was \$99.98 per fall and winter sessions, charged to all full-time undergraduate Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students (\$49.59 for part-time students and \$24.59 for Professional Experience Year [PEY] students). The fee included:

- \$26.16 per fall and winter sessions for the society portion of the fee (\$24.59 part-time & PEY);
- \$2.25 per fall and winter sessions for the Human-Powered Vehicle Design portion of the fee (fulltime only).
- \$50.00 per fall and winter sessions for the Skule Endowment Fund portion of the fee (\$25.00 part-time); and
- \$1.90 per fall and winter sessions for the Skule Night portion of the fee (full-time only).

Requests

1. A cost-of-living increase in the society portion of the fee.

At its meeting held on March 15, 2020, the EngSoc Board of Directors approved a resolution to seek a cost-of-living increase in the society portion of the fee.

In the course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints.

2. The establishment of the Canadian Federation of Engineering Students portion of the fee. A referendum was held from March 27, 2020 to March 30, 2020, in which undergraduate Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students were asked to support the establishment of the dedicated Canadian Federation of Engineering Students portion of the EngSoc fee. The wording of the question was as follows:

TL;DR - Proposal to rejoin the Canadian Federation of Engineering Students (CFES) by paying \$0.67/year per student for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years. The CFES is a national student organization that all major engineering schools in Canada are a part of. Their work is divided into the services that they offer, which are a number of events and conferences, as well as their advocacy work. As a member, U of T students would be able to attend the conferences they offer, including the Canadian Engineering Conference, Conference on Diversity and on Sustainability in Engineering. U of T would also be able to provide input on their advocacy work, which in the past has focused on accreditation requirements and learning units, and speaking on behalf of the member schools to the Engineering Deans Canada about co-op programs, workload, and EDI.

The Canadian Federation of Engineering Students (CFES) is a national, bilingual organization that represents the majority of engineering schools across Canada. Offering services ranging from leadership development conferences, to technical skill competitions, and other outreach efforts, the CFES aims to provide opportunities in support of an all-encompassing education for engineering students in Canada to allow them to become unparalleled professionals in their field. Their work is divided into two main buckets: services for members, and advocacy work to external organizations.

Over the past few years, the CFES has been working with the Canadian Accreditation Board to push for a number of changes, including a new approach to accreditation requirements that accounts for material learned (incorporating time taken doing homework assignments, etc) instead of just hours in class, which is what the current accreditation units count. They also work with Engineering Deans Canada, and other Engineering Societies across Canada to help advance engineering schools and ensure that we move in the right direction. Other focuses of their advocacy work include Quality of Student Internships, Student Mental Health and Workload, Sustainability, and Equity, Diversity and Inclusion.

The CFES runs a number of conferences for its member students. If U of T is not a member, U of T students would need special permission from the organizing committees to attend the conferences, regardless of if they qualify from other competitions. The list of conferences include:

- Canadian Engineering Competition (CEC)
- Conference on Diversity in Engineering (CDE): aims to develop knowledge surrounding the variety of individuals, cultures and perspectives found within engineering communities.
- Conference on Sustainability in Engineering (CSE): aims to raise awareness about issues in sustainability and environmental engineering, and encourage students to discuss and design solutions to counter them.
- Lean 6 Sigma: three-day L6S Green Belt certification course.

- Canadian Engineering Leadership Conference (CELC): provides a platform from which students can collaborate with and learn from our industry partners, sponsors and fellow students.

3. An increase in the Human-Powered Vehicle Design portion of the fee.

A referendum was held from March 27, 2020 to March 30, 2020, in which undergraduate Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students were asked to support an increase to the dedicated Human-Powered Vehicle Design portion of EngSoc fee. The wording of the question was as follows:

Do you support a \$2.48 per semester per student levy for Human Powered Vehicles Design Team for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 terms? (\$2.48 per semester per student for both Fall and Winter semesters, for a total of \$4.96 annually).

In the course of considering this request, the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students has not received any complaints.

4. The continuation of the Skule Endowment Fund portion of the fee.

A referendum was held from March 27, 2020 to March 30, 2020, in which undergraduate Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students were asked to support the continuation of the dedicated Skule Endowment Fund portion of the EngSoc fee. The wording of the question was as follows:

TL;DR – Proposal to continue the Skule Endowment Fund levy of \$100/year for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years. The Engineering Society and the University of Toronto have agreed to have the funds held and invested by the University while elected student representatives control the use of income or principal.

The Engineering Society is proposing the Skule Endowment Fund Levy of \$100 per year for fulltime students (\$50 per fall and winter sessions) and \$50 per year for part-time students (\$25 per fall and winter sessions), excluding students on PEY, for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years. The Skule Endowment Fund was established by referendum in the spring of 2011.

The Engineering Society has reached an agreement with the University of Toronto that allows the funds to be held and invested by the University in trust while elected student representatives retain control over the use of any income or principal.

Interest earned from the principal collected through the levy may be used each year to fund student life improvements. A capital improvement previously funded through similar student levies includes the renovation of the Sandford Fleming Atrium. The levy for the Skule Endowment Fund will be renewed by referendum every two years.

In addition, the principal of the fund can be spent on specific capital projects (e.g. the construction of co-curricular student space). These decisions will be made by elected student representatives with the Engineering Society.

Students will be able to opt out by the last Friday of February each year and reimbursement will be provided by the Engineering Society.

Do you support a \$1.95 per semester per student levy for Skule Nite for the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 terms? (\$1.95 per semester per student for both Fall and Winter semesters, for a total of \$3.90 annually).

Recommendations

THAT beginning in the Fall 2020 session, the **Engineering Society** fee be changed as follows:

- (a) an increase of \$0.55 per fall and winter sessions in the Society portion of the fee (\$0.52 part-time & PEY);
- (b) the establishment of \$0.34 per fall session and \$0.33 per winter session in the Canadian Federation of Engineering Students portion of the fee for full-time, part-time, and PEY students through 2021-22;
- (c) an increase of \$0.23 per fall and winter sessions in the Human-Powered Vehicle Design portion of the fee through 2021-22 (full-time only);
- (d) the continuation of the Skule Endowment Fund portion of the fee through 2021-22; and
- (e) the continuation of, and an increase of \$0.05 per fall and winter sessions in, the Skule Night portion of the fee through 2021-22 (full-time only).

If approved, the total EngSoc fee will be \$101.15 per fall session (\$50.45 for part-time students; \$25.45 for Professional Experience Year [PEY] students) and \$101.14 per winter session (\$50.44 for part-time students; \$25.44 for PEY students), charged to all undergraduate Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering students.

Faculty of Music Undergraduate Association (FMUA)

Background

In 2019-20, the FMUA fee was \$350.00 per fall and winter sessions, charged to all undergraduate Faculty of Music students. The fee included:

- \$100.00 per fall and winter sessions for the Endowment Fund portion of the fee; and
- \$200.00 per fall and winter sessions for the Special Projects Fund portion of the fee.

Requests

- 1. The continuation and decrease of the Endowment Fund portion of the fee.
 - A referendum was held from March 23, 2020 to March 27, 2020, in which undergraduate Faculty of Music students were asked to support the continuation and increase of the dedicated Endowment Fund portion of the FMUA fee. The wording of the question was as follows:

The FMUA is seeking consent from its membership to continue the FMUA Endowment fee. The FMUA is proposing to reduce the amount that undergraduate students contribute annually to the Endowment Fund beginning of the fall of 2020. Under this proposal, all undergraduate students registered with the Faculty of Music would contribute \$100.00 annually to the fund, as the fee is currently \$200.00 annually. Interest earned from the principal collected through the levy is used each year to improve the co-curricular experience of Faculty of Music undergraduate students. The principal of the fund is saved for capital projects such as the construction of future music student spaces. A decision to spend the principal of the fund must be brought forward to the membership at a General Meeting of the Faculty of Music Undergraduate Association. At the end of each fiscal year, the leftover funds may be reinvested in the FMUA Endowment Fund. This fee requires a referendum every 5 years to continue.
