



New companies created at US & Canadian universities (2015-16 to 2017-18)














- U of T's School of Cities established the Community-Builders Fellowships and partnered with the United Way to develop neighbourhood change in the Toronto region.




- In 2019, the VPRI announced the awards for the inaugural Community Partnership Research Program competition.







- Achieved the national target of 1% for Indigenous peoples. U of T is at 3%.



In 2019:

- VPRI organized and hosted two workshops:
 'EDI in Research Teams and HQP Training'
 'Diversity in Research Design'.
- VPRI and the Toronto Academic Health Science
 Network Research Committee co-organized a workshop
 "Putting Equity, Diversity and Inclusion into Practice".
- VPRI created an internal funding program for community-based research (recommendation #37); the first recipients of the Connaught Fund Community Partnership Research Program were announced.
- VPRI continues to integrate EDI considerations into the administration and adjudication of internal funding programs.






