LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

We would like to start by acknowledging the land from which I currently reside is the traditional territory of many nations including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnabeg, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee and the Wendat peoples and is now home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples. This is Dish With One Spoon Territory – a treaty between the Anishinaabe, Mississaugas and Haudenosaunee that bound them to share the territory and protect the land. Subsequent Indigenous Nations and peoples, Europeans and all newcomers, have been invited into this treaty in the spirit of peace, friendship and respect. We ALL reaffirm our commitment to this treaty as we build OUR movement. We all have a duty and responsibility to learn about the Indigenous land and territories that we are currently occupying. The land has an important history that we have a responsibility to learn and respect. This land is now home to many diverse First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples. Part of the responsibility of being a settler is to recognize what your role has been in settler-colonialism and your responsibility to dismantle colonialism. We also want to acknowledge that the impact of Canadian settler-colonialism, which is still being felt today. Whether it is the fact that there are currently over 100 water advisories spread across Indigenous peoples territories making it harder for these communities to protect themselves against COVID-19; the ongoing violations of sovereign territories for pipeline expansion and nuclear waste disposal; the missing and murdered indigenous women, girls and 2Spirit people; the deaths and violence Indigenous people experience at the hands of RCMP and police, or in the disgraceful levels of poverty that sees over half of all Indigenous children living in poverty. We, as treaty peoples, affirm our commitment to building a movement that seeks to end these injustices.






