HIGHLIGHTS:

1. Ontario Ministry of Labour (MOL) & Public Health Visits and Orders

During this reporting period, the MOL contacted us seven times, including twice at UTM and four times at St George to review measures and procedures implemented to manage reported COVID-19 positive cases, and to follow up on a complaint. There was one visit at UTSC related to asbestos. No orders issued.

During this reporting period Toronto Public Health (TPH) notified the university of three anonymous complaints regarding allegations of COVID-19 non-compliance on the St George

campus. The university followed up on these matters and no follow up action was required by Toronto Public Health.

2. Regulatory Visits

During this reporting period there were no regulatory visits.

3. Incidents Abroad Relating to Students

During this reporting period, there were no travel activities, no incidences to report.

4. Summary

In summary, based on the reports I have received through the operation of our occupational health and safety policy, and to the best of my knowledge, the University is in compliance with its health and safety obligations.
