PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The annual report was provided for information to the Academic Affairs Committee on May 4, 2020.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- The OVPR's primary focus through 2020-21 has been to facilitate the research ramp-down and subsequent staged restart activities in response to the pandemic, including implementing new administrative 'research restart' procedures, managing Canada Research Continuity Emergency Fund (CRCEF) cost-recovery programs, and aiding PPH in the vaccination site preparations.
- Core facilities operated by the OVPR all now have Senior Research Associate leads, and their work has been critical in ensuring smooth, safe operation of mission-critical research infrastructure through the pandemic. The SRAs are all establishing long-term infrastructure renewal plans and are collaborating on developing programming to support UTM's PDF community.

- Elspeth Brown has been appointed as Associate VPR, and will advance UTM-engagement in Institutional Strategic Initiatives.
- OVPR launched new internal funding schemes, including: 'Black, Indigenous, and Racialized Scholar/Research Grant Program', 'First Book Manuscript Workshop Competition', 'UTM Tri-Council PDF Top-Up Program', and 'COVID-Response Transit Reimbursement policy for graduate students/PDFs'.
- As of April 5th 2021, UTM research revenues for 2020-21 is ~\$14.8M (recent tri-council results not included)
- View to the U had its most 'listened to' year, with an international audience across 50 countries. The top five most popular episodes are those featuring Loren Martin, Jennifer Stellar, Alex Gillespie, Ron Buliung, and John Paul Ricco.

COVID-19 RAMP-DOWN & RESTART

- Veron processed 35 critical research continuation requests in March 2020, and ~150 research restart forms throughout 2020-21, requiring coordination with HR & Campus Police
- Rong facilitated UTM's Canada Research Continuity Emergency Fund (CRCEF) processes; Stage 3 provided \$300K, + ~\$50K top-up for Pls from the OVPR's Research Fund
- Maeve returned to BMC when their program coordinator left
- Carla managed the 2020 grant season solo, processing & supporting over 260 grant applications, including 3 CFI JELFs.
- Coordinated with Peel Public Health to support the vaccination site, with Peter, Xin, and Mirek providing on-campus assistance.

2020-2021: **\$14.8M** REVENUES

- \$14.8M research revenues for UTM as of April 5, 2021, from all sponsors (but not including any Tri-Council funding from the fall 2020 competitions). This is an increase from 2019-2020, when our revenues were \$13.2M.
- For comparison UTSC's 2020-2021 revenues are \$14.8M, and FAS's is \$87.1M
- 2020 SSHRC Insight Grant results recently arrived, and UTM's success rate was 53%. We've maintained our usual high success rate, even through the pandemic, and one-person short on the OVPR's grant team.

PROMOTING SUCCESS

Our research communications team lost Maeve to BMC, but Carla has continued to implement the OVPR's research communication strategy.
