Status Report on UTSC Campus Strategic Priorities

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

On October 26, 2020, a presentation on the Status Report on Campus Strategic Priorities was shared with the Campus Affairs Committee (CAC), for information. It was also presented for information to the UTSC Campus Council on November 17, 2020.

At its meeting on May 3, 2021, the CAC received, for information, a presentation on the 2021-22 UTSC Campus Operating Budget. It was also presented for information to the UTSC Campus Council on May 20, 2021.

HIGHLIGHTS:

In this high-level overview of the campus strategic priorities, the Committee will receive information on the overall goals and direction of the campus with in relation to the UTSC Strategic Plan: *Inspiring Inclusive Excellence A strategic vision for the University of Toronto Scarborough*.

A local, campus-specific administrative review process will take place prior to the Academic Budget Review (ABR) in late Fall 2021. It will be followed with an Institutional Operating Budget presentation, for information, to the Campus Council in Cycle 4.

In Cycle 5, a presentation on the Campus Operating Budget will be presented to the UTSC Campus Affairs Committee and the Campus Council, for information. The presentation will address enrolment, complement, expense priorities, and capital plans for the upcoming academic year.

Institutional Budget Context



2021–22 \$3.12 Billion





Pension Special Payment \$127M



BUDGET TYPES

Operating Budget

- Funded by tuition, government grants, endowment payouts etc.
- Day to day operating costs
- Capital development

Student Services Fee

- Funded directly through students for services such as Health and Wellness, Athletics, Student Clubs etc..
- Includes student levees such as Student Centre, Toronto Pan Am Sports Centre

Ancillary Budget

User based services such as Food Services, Parking, Student Residence



BUDGET PROCESS



- Planning and Priorities -Vice- President and Principal (spring to early summer)
 - Internal UTSC process
 - Establishes campus priorities for the upcoming year (both strategic and operational)
 - Requests and allocations made on a portfolio level
- Academic Budget Review Provost (Fall)
 - Consolidated campus plan for review and discussion
- Divisional Advisory Committee President (late fall early winter)
 - University wide shared services
- University Budget Spring




