- develop protocols and processes for identifying and naming spaces that present naming opportunities,
 including consultations, languages to be used, and project selection framework;
- explore, identify, prioritize, and recommend implementation plans for place-making and wayfinding on campus, including timelines, renaming of existing plaques, walkways or spaces




PLACE MAKING COMMITTEE 2022 OBJECTIVES



- Develop place making guidelines for use across campus
 - integrated approach to Indigenizing the campus
 - work in concert with the UTSC Strategic Plan & UofT TRC report
 - signals our intentions re. place making to communities and our partners
- Translate names of identified spaces into Metis, First Nations and Inuit languages
 - Rock Walk, Scholars Way & Valley Trail identified by former TRC Coordinating Group for renaming
- Rename MW building
 - Visible sign of our commitment to creating welcoming spaces
 - Inclusive and participatory process for campus community





TIMELINE



Spring/Fall 2021:

- committee held inaugural meeting
- received endorsement from TRIIAC to pursue priorities for 2021/22
- hosted first virtual place making and MW renaming consultation session for campus community


Winter/Spring 2022


- draft place making guidelines for use across campus

- rename MW building








THE MW BUILDING











TIMELINE FOR RENAMING OF MW BUILDING



November – February: consultation and planning

- develop communications strategy
- solicit input on name (ethos of building in English) from campus community via consultation
 - November 18th, 2021, virtual session open to all students, staff and faculty
 - In process of scheduling additional session for campus community
- bring themes/concepts forward to Place Making Sub-committee for distillation
- consult Elders, Knowledge Keepers and language speakers re. the application of languages

March: recommendation and approval

- bring name(s) forward on behalf of Place Making Sub-committee to the TRIIAC for input and recommendation to the Executive Team
- Executive Team will bring forward to the Vice-President & Principal for approval
- inform campus community and key stakeholders
