

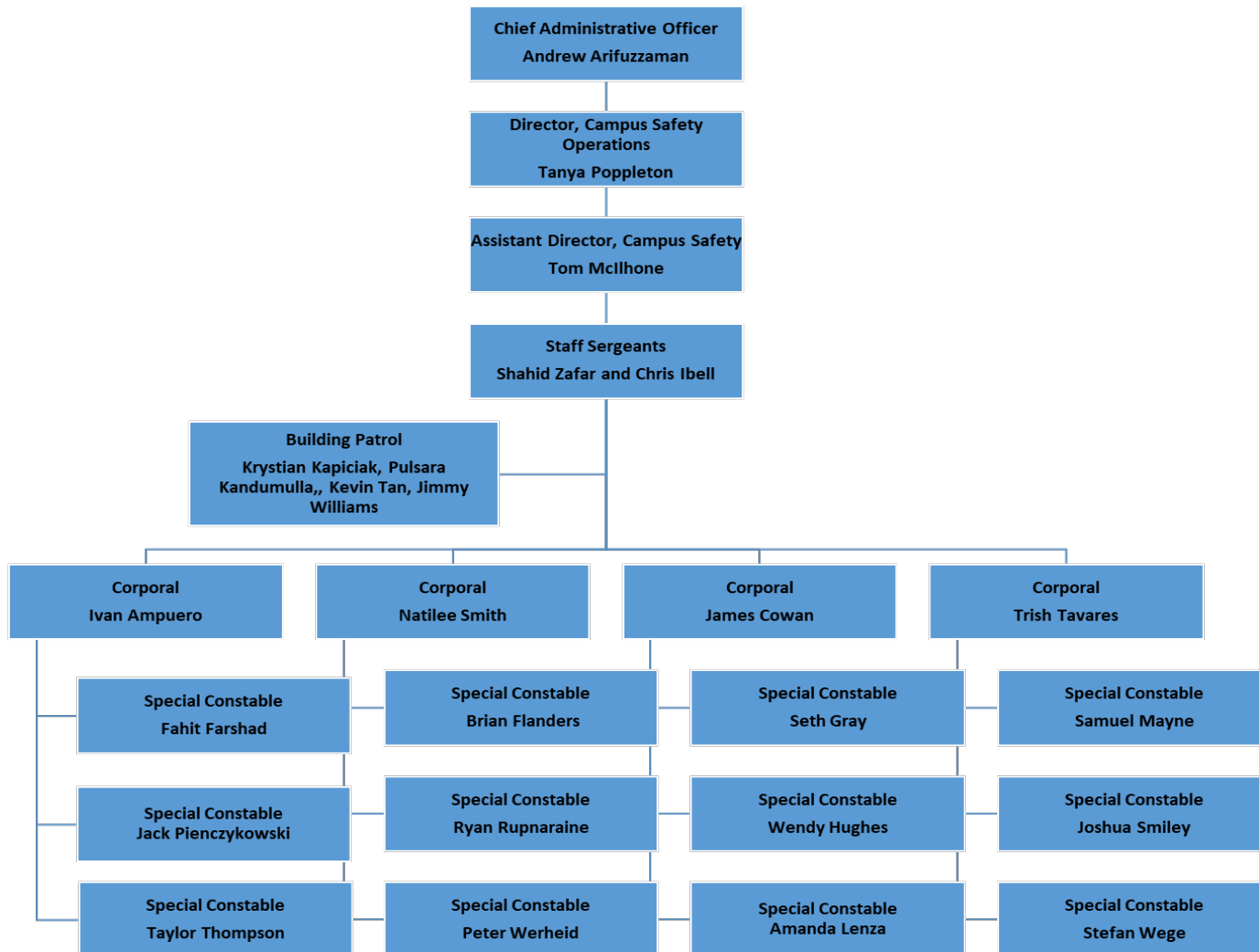

## Recruiting and Retention

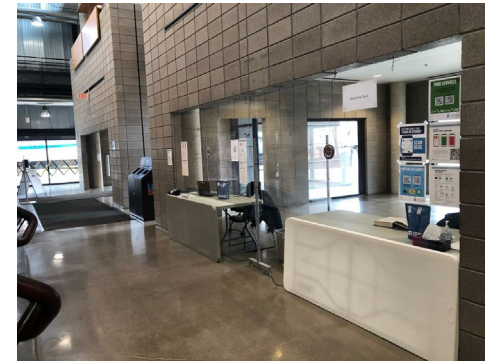
- Campus Safety's authorized complement

- 2021, 2 separations
  - 1 transfer in from St. George Campus Safety
  - 1 temporary contract
- Future Recruiting
  - Collaboration with Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Officer and Indigenous Initiatives Director to explore ways to increase future candidates from the BIPOC community
  - Review hiring practices



## Campus Access

### Restricted Access

- For 2022, restricted access remained in place with points at the Academic Research Centre (ARC) and Science Wing
  - to ensure the safety of the students, faculty and staff that were required to attend campus
  - provided an efficient process for contact tracing, and information for Facilities Management to identify and disinfect areas of use.
- Study space and Wi-Fi access remained available in the Library and Computer Commons

- Released in December 2019
- Recommendation #6:
  - Enhance coordination and expand direct crisis response support and resources and establish a tri-campus mobile team for after-hours support
- Additional Campus Safety position and funding
  - Student Crisis Coordinator role providing immediate support to students (Mental Health Professional)
  - Minimize Special Constable (uniform) involvement
  - Provide current and relevant training to Campus Safety members and community
- Planning began October 2021, Recruitment in January 2022 with on-boarding April 2022





## Community Engagement

The focus on Community Engagement is to build partnerships with the community to fully understand their needs and work with them to find and prioritize solutions.

Due to the reduced number of community members on campus during 2021, there was limited opportunity to engage in these initiatives.
