### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

The Diploma in Investigative & Forensic Accounting (DIFA) was offered at the Professional Graduate Programs Centre and later at the Institute for Management & Innovation (IMI) from 2001 to 2017. In response to the evolving landscape of the industry, a master's level degree

program in forensic accounting, Master of Forensic Accounting, (MFAcc) was created and offered at IMI starting in May 2018. The MFAcc replaced the DIFA. The DIFA was approved to close through university governance effective April 30, 2022.

As part of the transition from the DIFA to the Master of Forensic Accounting (MFAcc) program, the MFAcc has offered an Advanced Standing Option (ASO) for graduates1 of the Diploma in Investigative & Forensic Accounting (DIFA) program. This ASO was an opportunity for DIFA graduates to enrol in the MFAcc Program and upgrade/ enhance their knowledge and skills to a master's level research understanding and remain competitive with the industry standard to have master's level training in this discipline. The University approved a total of three ASO offerings, each of which involve four standalone sections of existing MFAcc courses (IFA 1905H, IFA 1906H, IFA 2905H, and IFA 2906H) plus a Residency session. These courses will continue to remain part of the MFAcc curriculum and program requirements.

As of August 2020, all three offerings of the ASO have been completed and all students in the ASO have completed their program. There are currently no students enrolled in the ASO. In acknowledgement of the completion of the three ASO offerings and with no additional demand from DIFA graduates, this current proposal is to close the Advanced Standing Option for DIFA graduates effective December 31, 2022.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

THAT the Diploma in Investigative & Forensic Accounting - Advanced Standing Option, part of the Master of Forensic Accounting (MFAcc) program, be closed, effective December 31, 2022, as detailed in the proposal dated September 30, 2022.

The Diploma in Investigative & Forensic Accounting (DIFA) was offered at the Professional Graduate Programs Centre and later at the Institute for Management & Innovation (IMI) from 2001 to 2017. In response to the evolving landscape of the industry, a master's level degree program in forensic accounting, Master of Forensic Accounting, (MFAcc) was created and offered at IMI starting in May 2018. The MFAcc replaced the DIFA. The DIFA was approved to close through university governance effective April 30, 2022.

As part of the transition from the DIFA to the Master of Forensic Accounting (MFAcc) program, the MFAcc has offered an Advanced Standing Option (ASO) for graduates<sup>1</sup> of the Diploma in Investigative & Forensic Accounting (DIFA) program. This ASO was an opportunity for DIFA graduates to enrol in the MFAcc Program and upgrade/ enhance their knowledge and skills to a master's level research understanding and remain competitive with the industry standard to have master's level training in this discipline. DIFA graduates are given advanced standing for 6 of the 10 courses in the new MFAcc degree. The ASO program provides the missing 4 courses for the MFAcc degree, plus a Residency session.

The Diploma in Investigative & Forensic Accounting (DIFA) was offered at the Professional Graduate Programs Centre and later at through Institute for Management & Innovation from 2001 to 2017. In response to the evolving landscape of the industry, a master's level degree program in forensic accounting, the Master of Forensic Accounting, (MFAcc) was created and offered at IMI starting in May 2018. The MFAcc replaced the DIFA and the DIFA was approved to close through university governance effective April 30, 2022.

In order to support DIFA graduates who wished to acquire the expertise of the new master's program, an advanced-standing option (ASO) was created in the MFAcc in to allow DIFA graduates to upgrade and enhance their knowledge and skills to a master's level research understanding and remain competitive with the industry standard to have master's level training in this discipline. The ASO was originally created to be offered three times, once each in 2018, 2019, and 2020 with enrolments of 21, 28, and 13 students, respectively. In 2020, at the completion of the three offerings, it was assessed by the MFAcc Director and IMI Director that the demand by DIFA graduates for an advanced standing option has been satisfied, and no further ASO offerings were or are needed. The ASO for DIFA Graduates was administratively suspended to further admissions on January 12, 2021.

The MFAcc Program has no intention to offer standalone ASO courses in future as they were designed specifically for DIFA graduates to upgrade/ enhance their skills to the master's level. Existing MFAcc courses are already designed to address this content and develop these skills as part of the MFAcc curriculum and program learning outcomes.

There are no students currently enrolled in the ASO. All previously enrolled students have completed the program.
