HLTA91H3: A Healthy Campus for Students: Prioritizing Mental Health and Wellness

Rationale:

The department seeks to add 'Wellness' to the title of the course to highlight that content will not focus solely on aspects of mental health. The course description references the importance in prioritizing physical health and self-care activities. This is reflected in the course material and lectures that focus on nutrition, exercise and fitness, and social and cultural paradigms that all contribute to a state of wellbeing. The change will better align the title of the course with the material currently being covered in lectures. It is also important for students to understand that overall physical wellness can be a contributing factor to the state of one's mental health and that the two work in synergy with one another.

We seek to also add a note section to highlight there is an experiential learning component to this course, and more importantly, that there is a physical movement aspect that students will need to actively participate in.

We seek to change the enrollment cap for this course to 40 students. Since its introduction into our curriculum, we have not taken more than 40 students as that is a manageable amount based on the physical activities planned.

HLTB44H3: Introduction to Pathophysiology and The Etiology of Diseases

Rationale:

HLTB44H3 introduces students to occurrences in the body as it goes through various stages of disease. However, in order to fully comprehend and appreciate

Rationale:

The rationale for this change is:

- This change allows the course material HLTC20 to build on material and skills mastered in HLTB60.

- This change therefore supports a comprehensive disability studies course sequence, and an improved student experience in both courses.

- Students who took HLTC20 following HLTB60 in the 2021-2022 academic year performed better in aggregate than peers who did not take HLTB60; - students who took both courses in sequence in 2021-2022 stated that adding the prerequisite would be helpful: taking B60 helped them do well in C20, and they observed other students struggling with basic concepts that were covered more extensively in B60.

- Following a Dean's committee to study the possibility of a disability & ableism studies major or minor, our department is undertaking the work of building out a course sequence.

- We now have a B-level Introduction to Interdisciplinary Disability Studies course (running for the second time in 2022). That will serve as the entry-level course for the sequence. Therefore, this C-level course (which pre-existed the B-level) no longer needs to cover the basic background about disability studies, providing that students first take the B-level (HLTB60).
