PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The annual report was provided for information to the Academic Affairs Committee on May 9, 2022.

HIGHLIGHTS:

The Academic Integrity Unit (AIU) in Office of the Vice-Principal Academic & Dean manages all allegations of undergraduate academic misconduct, with the goal of bringing a resolution to each case. The AIU provides support to faculty, staff, and students on all issues and processes related to academic integrity at UTM.

This report covers the period from September 1, 2021 to August 31, 2022. The report highlights the number of cases that are resolved at the Departmental, Divisional, and Tribunal levels. The statistics provide information related to the number of cases per academic year, the number of cases within each department, the number of offences by year of study, and the number of

offences by offence type. The numbers include cases that have been resolved with sanctions and those that have been dismissed.



UofT supports the International Centre for Academic Integrity's definition of academic integrity as acting in all academic matters with honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility, and courage. Whether teaching, learning, researching, or working, members of the UofT community must conduct themselves honestly and with integrity. This reinforces the University's reputation as a leading teaching and research institution. The responsibilities of all members of the University in this regard are described in the *Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters* (the *Code*).


The primary roles of the AIU are to:

- Promote academic integrity and intellectual honesty to the UTM community.




