

Statistical Highlights



- Increase in overall # of criminal occurrences since last year
- Theft under \$5,000.00 increased by 15
 - > One arrest for someone likely responsible for several of these
- Mischiefs increased by 6
- One Hate Crime, graffiti in washroom, quickly removed
- Other offences, involving Fraud, increased by 5
 - > Fraud Working Group Tri-Campus approach implemented

Statistical Highlights



- Decrease in number of alarms
- Increase in number of Fire alarms
 Primarily in residence, at full capacity
- Substantial increase in Assist Community Member category by just over 1,000 due to more detailed classification during the year
- Decrease in Suspicious Persons calls, increase in Suspicious Circumstances

- Decrease in Trespass investigations
- Increase in Motor Vehicle Collisions
- Increase in Medicals by 109
 - ➤ More people on campus
 - ➤ Most related to TPASC
- Increase in Mental Health calls over last year
 - ➤ Still below pre-pandemic levels



Recruiting and Retention



- Campus Safety's authorized complement
 - 19 Special Constables
- 2022, 4 separations
 - > 3 left to pursue careers with local Police Services
 - > 1 retirement
- Retirement of Tom McIlhone September 2022, replaced by Chris Ibell
- New Staff Sergeant hired Ivan Ampuero started January 2023
- Ongoing Recruiting
 - Currently in process to hire 4 Special Constables Background phase
 - Continuing to work toward and explore ways to ensure that future candidates are community-minded and reflect the UTSC community





University President and Provost Task Force on Student Mental Health





- Recommendation #6: Enhance coordination and expand direct crisis response support and resources and establish a tri-campus mobile team for after-hours support
- Response: Hiring of Community Crisis Coordinator providing immediate support to students as a Mental Health Professional
 - ➤ Minimizes Special Constable (uniformed) involvement
 - Provides current and relevant training to Campus Safety members and community
 - Provides mobile crisis response
 - Follows up with students with whom Special Constables have interacted
