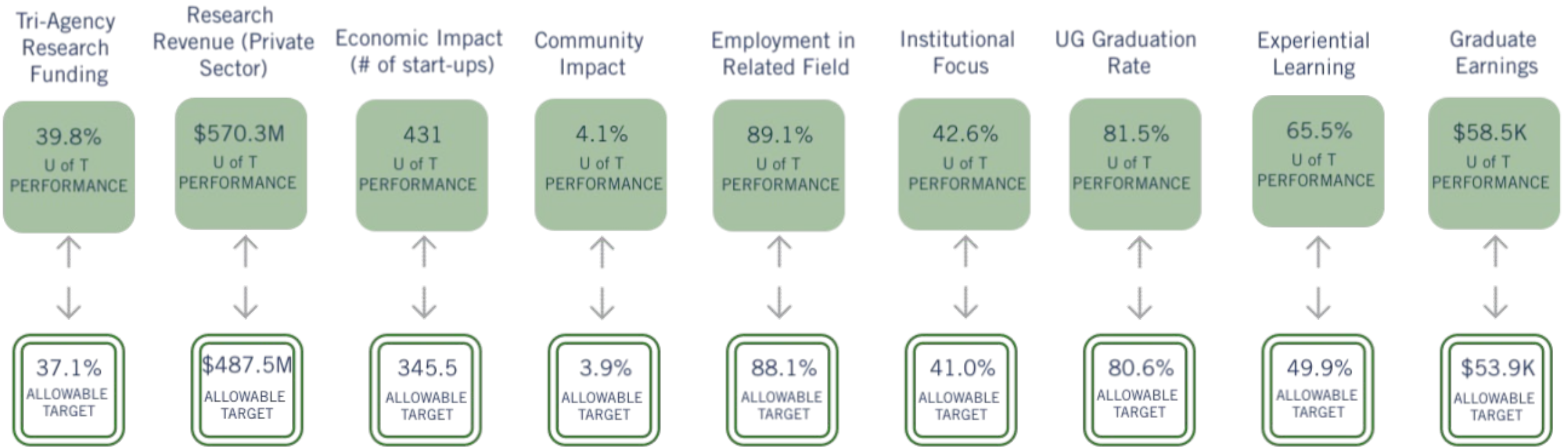

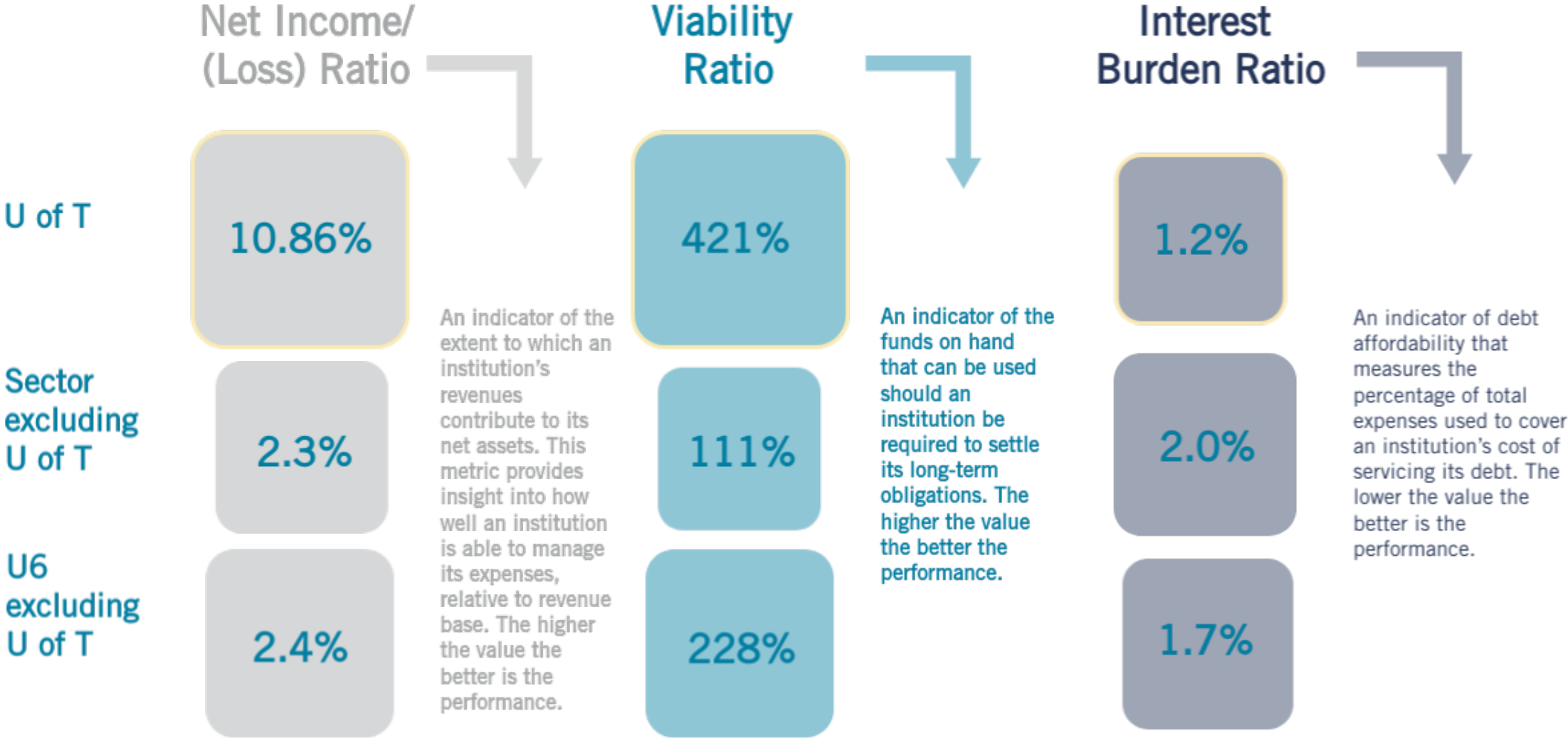
Year 3 Results (2022-23)

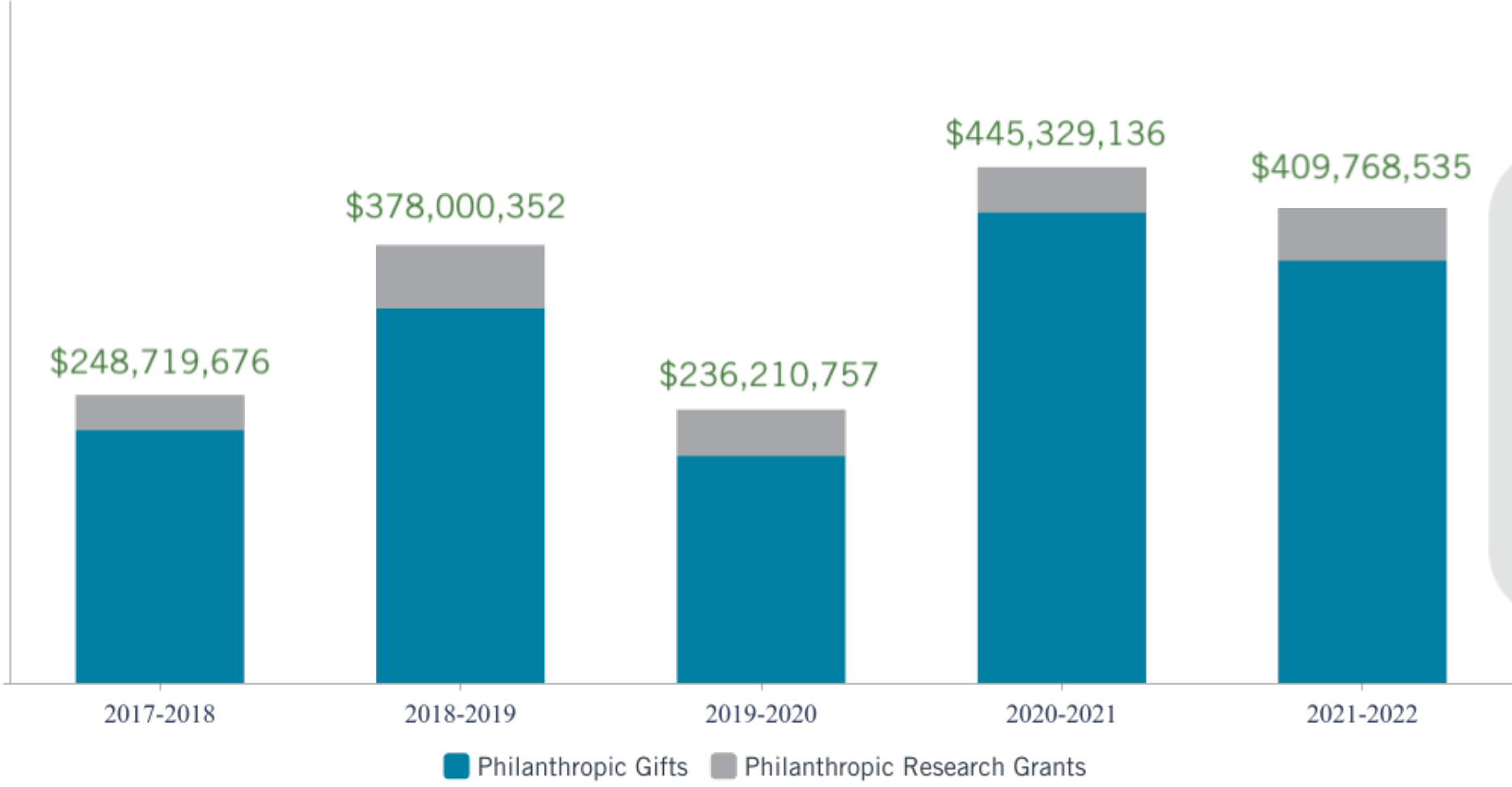

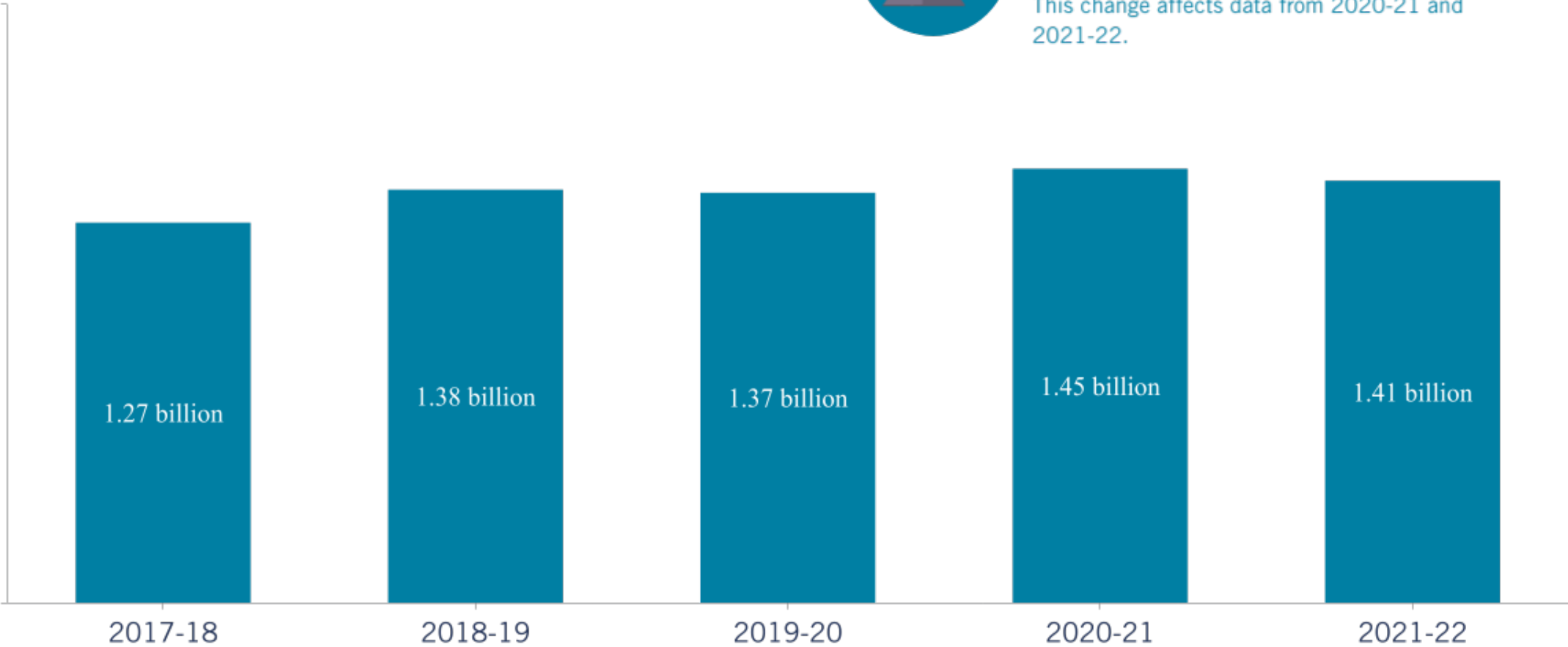
Overall University Funding 2017-18 to 2021-22

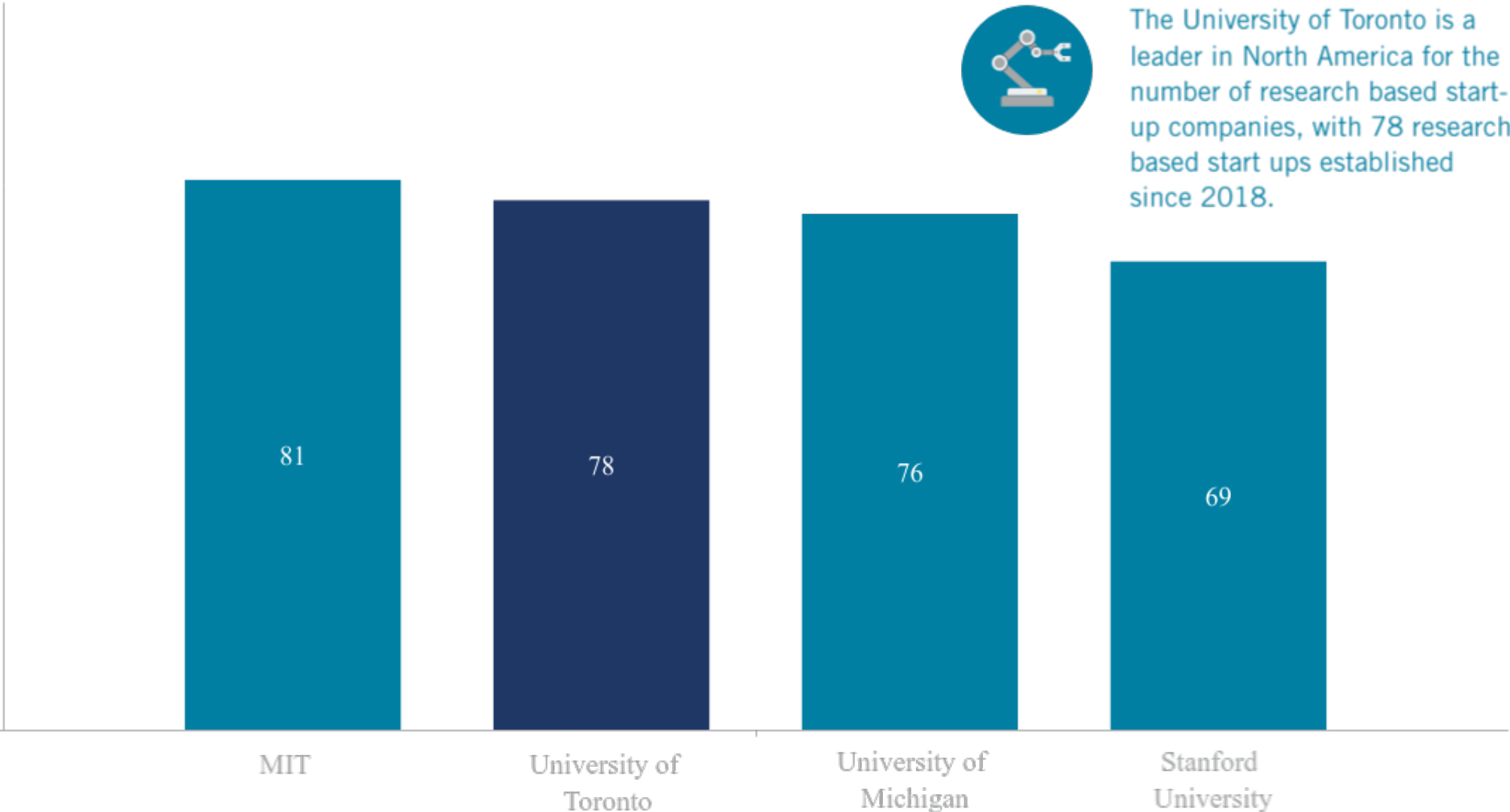

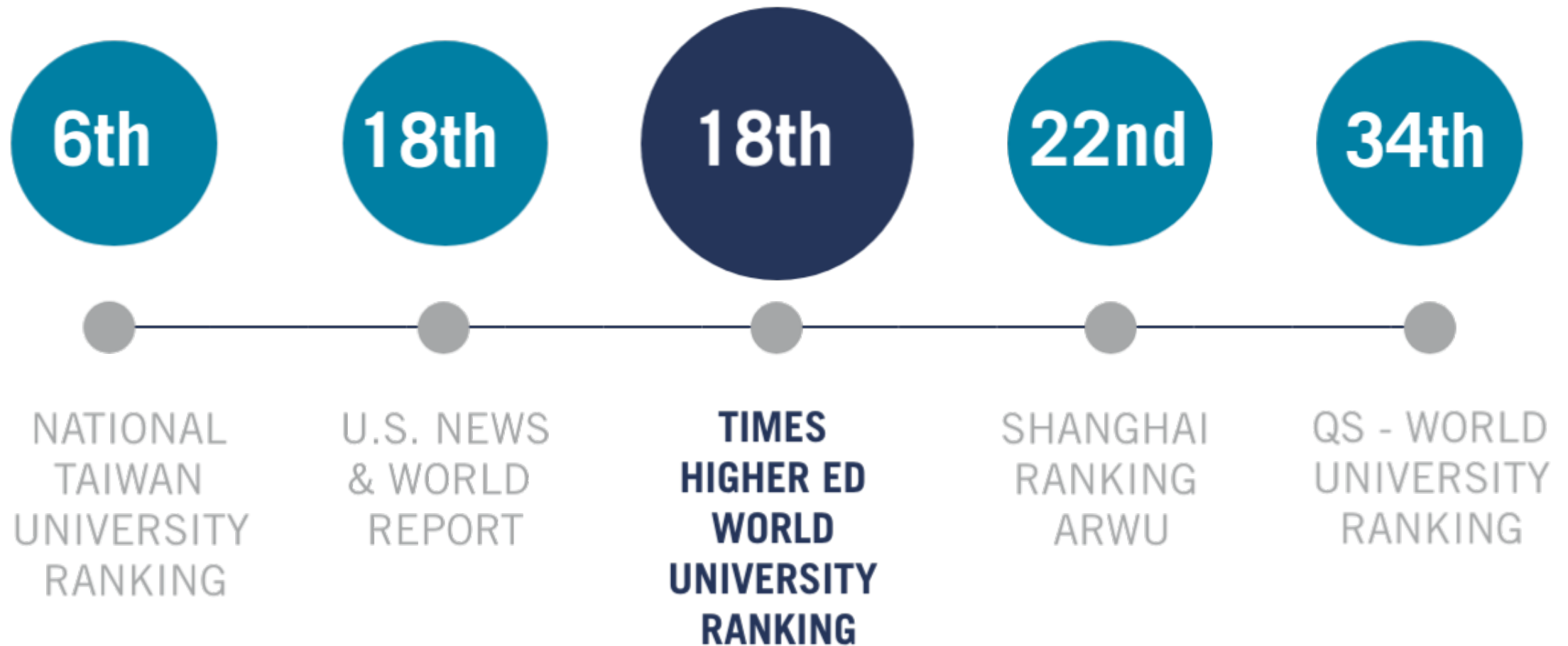


The University of Toronto is a leader in North America for the number of research based start-up companies, with 78 research based start ups established since 2018.

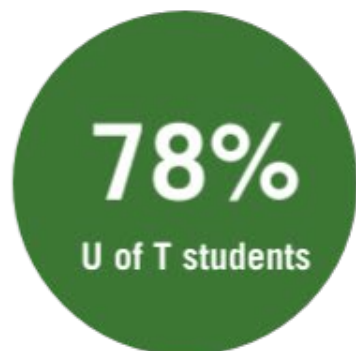

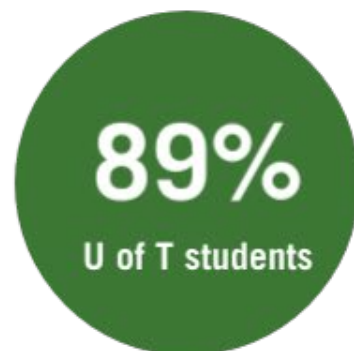

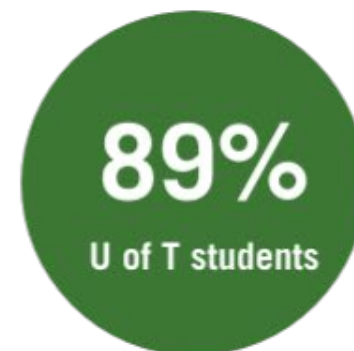

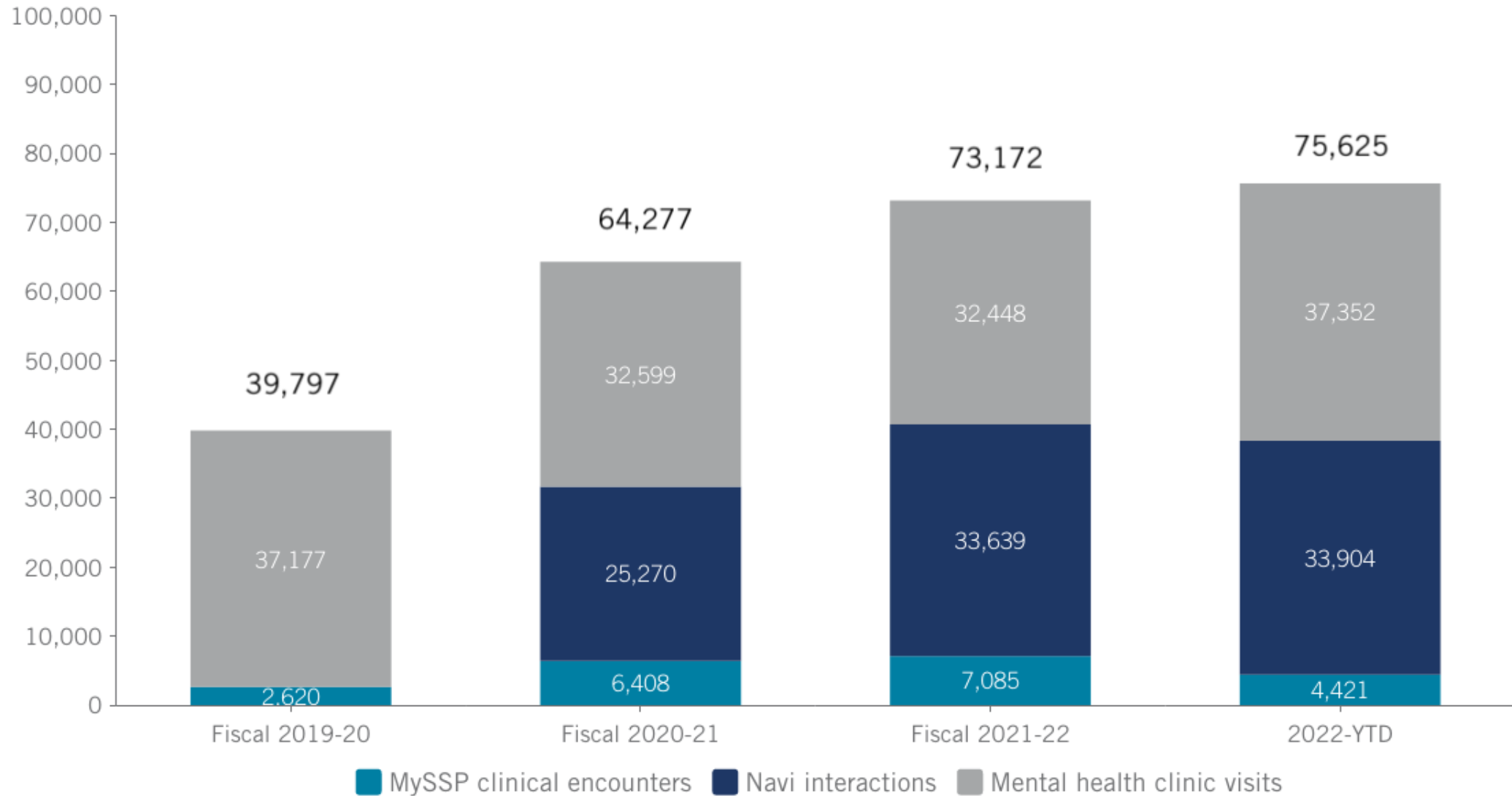

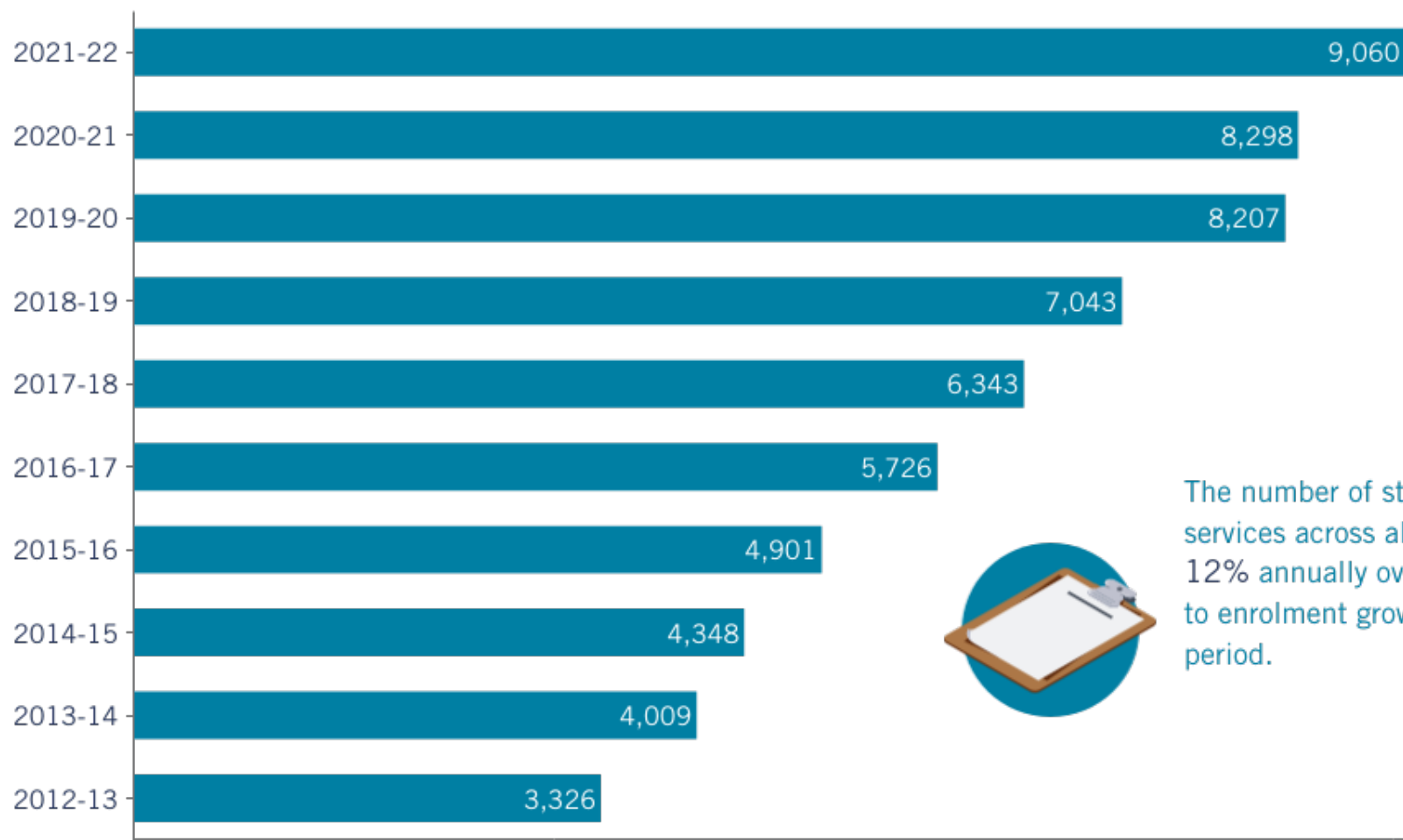

St. George, UTM & UTSC Campuses

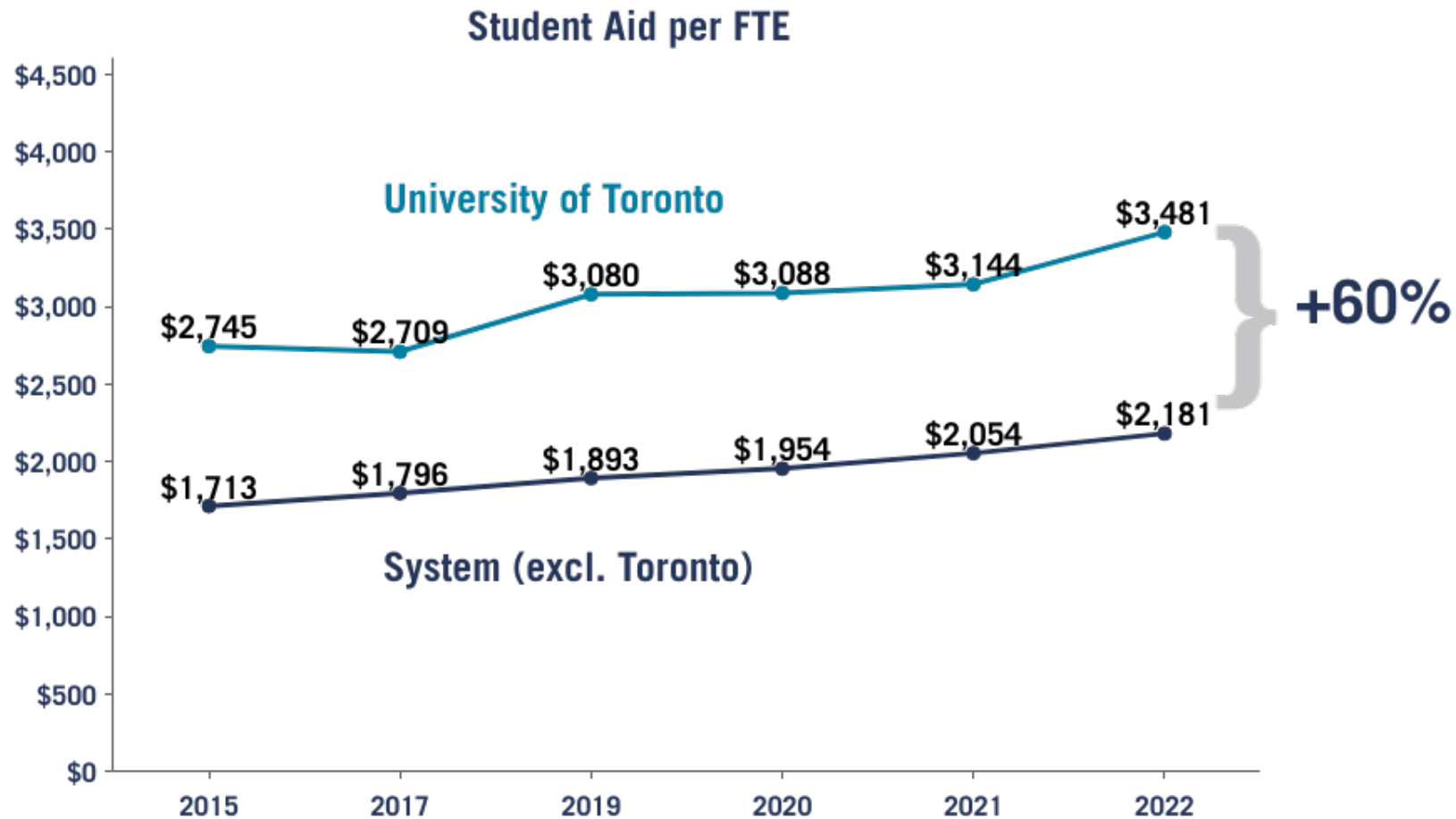


The number of students registered with accessibility services across all three campuses has increased by 12% annually over the last 10 years. This compares to enrolment growth of 1% annually over the same period.

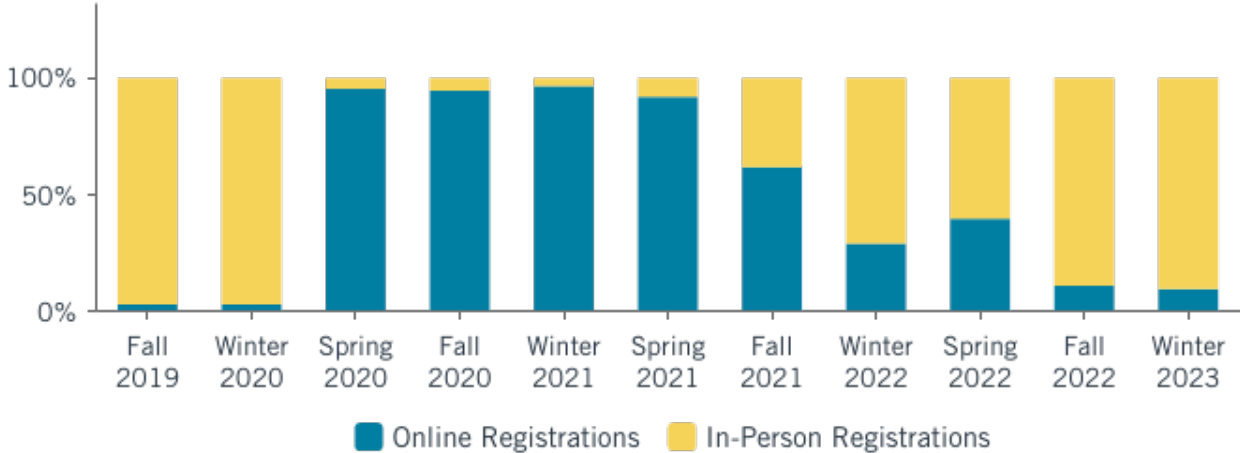

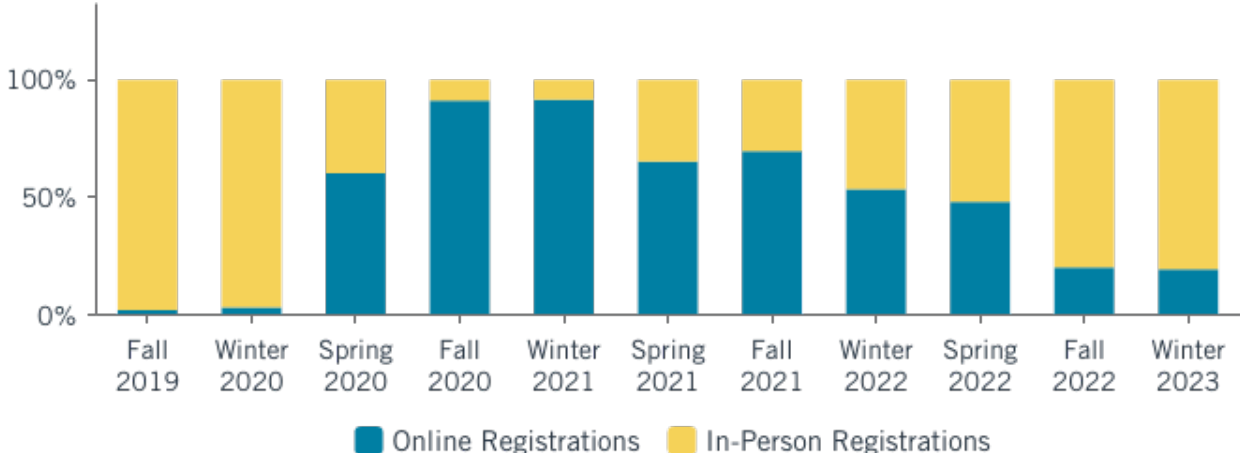
### Undergraduate Student Course Registration

Total Number of Graduating Students with Experiential Learning

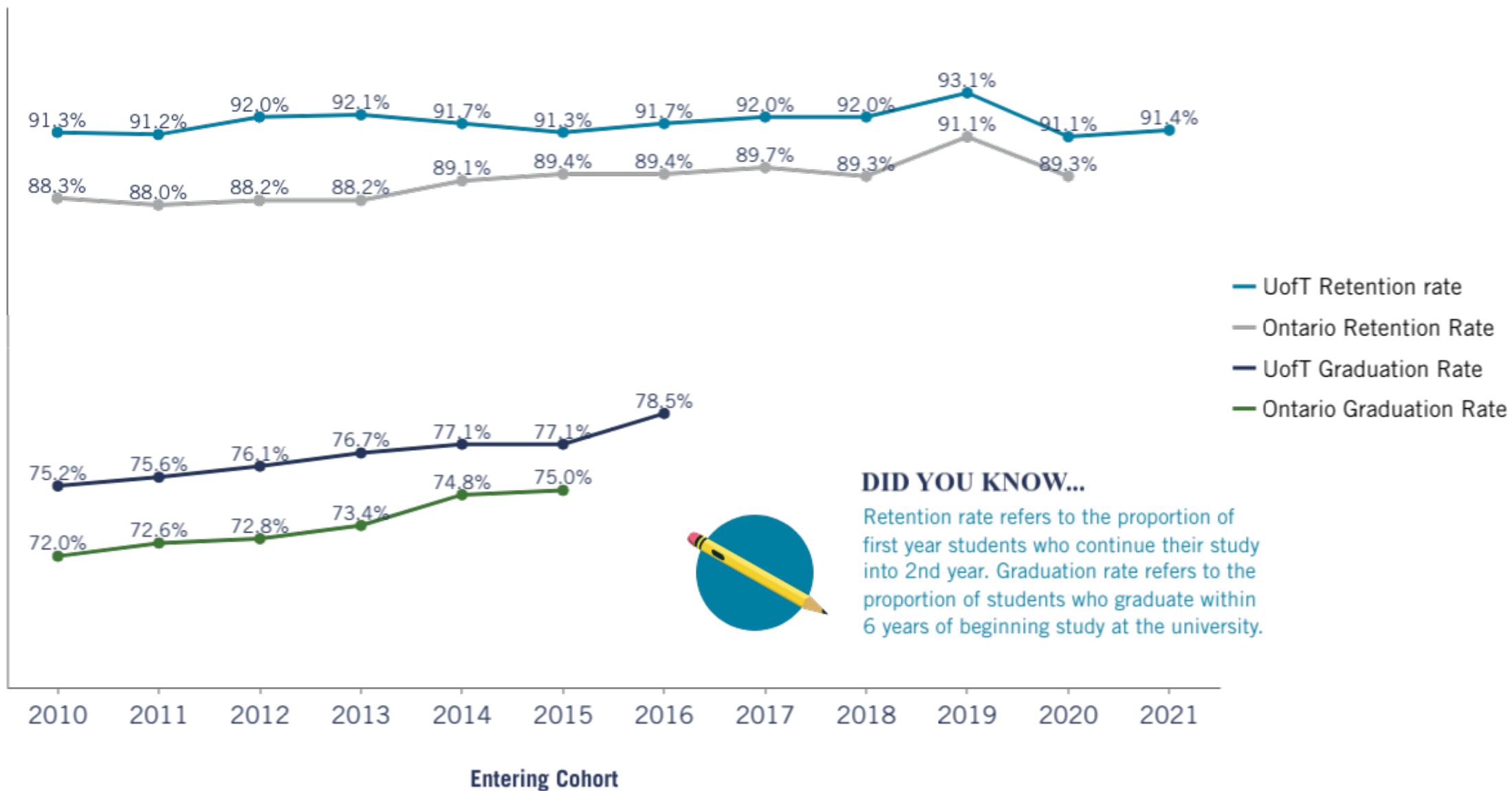


This analysis refers to the number of graduating students who have participated in at least one course with an experiential learning component. There are many other types of experiential learning experiences available at U of T that are not included.

The 2019 Employment Rate was 94.5% for Ontario (excluding U of T) and 91.7% for the GTA (excluding U of T).



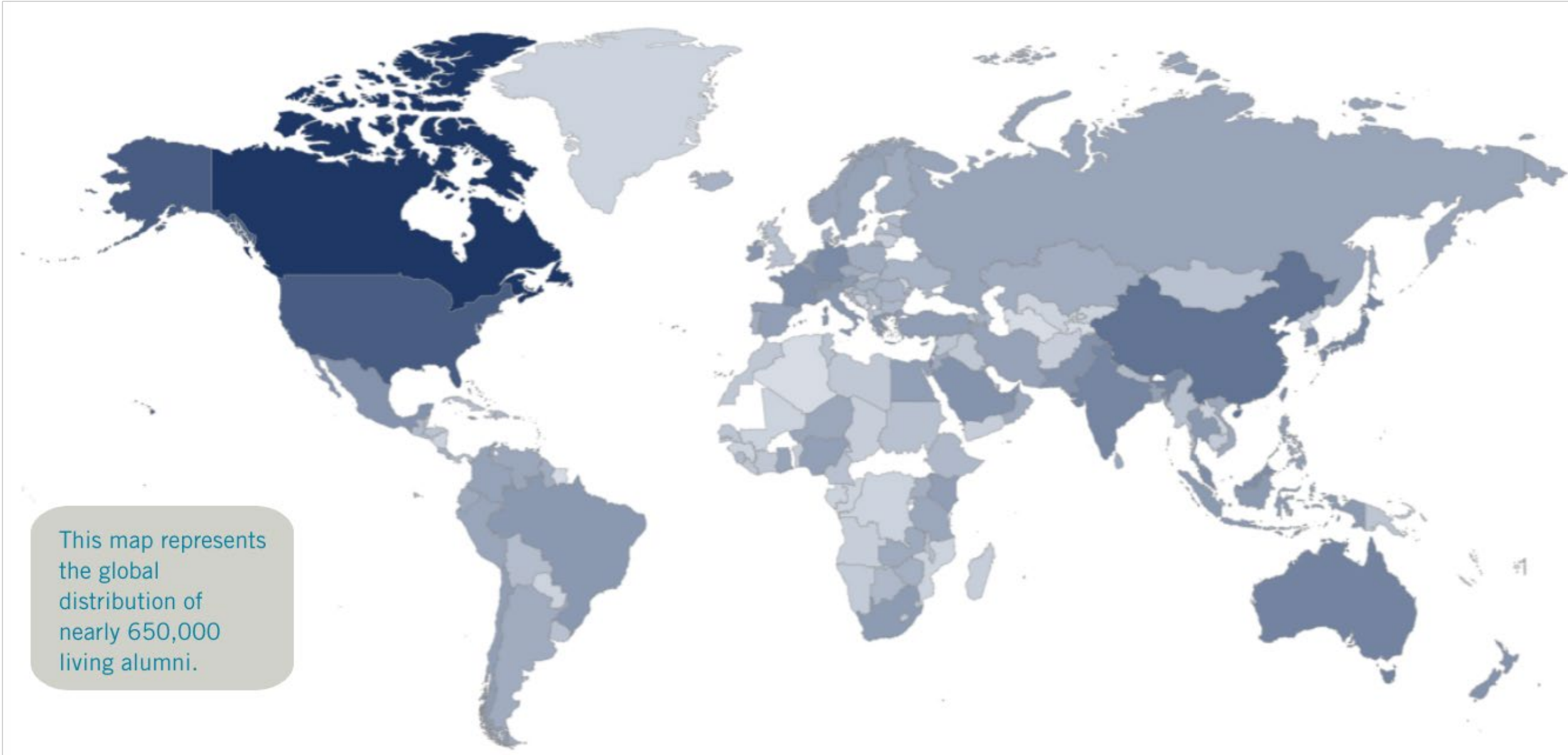
## The Employment Rate

Represents graduates in the labour market who indicate they have found employment 2 years after graduation. The 2-year employment rate for U of T graduates has decreased during the COVID-19 pandemic similar to other Universities. A slight improvement is seen in employment rate in the most recent survey of 2019 graduates. Please note that 2019 graduates were interviewed regarding their employment status in 2021. As of early 2023, the 2022 survey results are not yet available.
