PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

This annual report was last presented to the University Affairs Board on May 31, 2023.

HIGHLIGHTS:

In accordance with the University's *Policy on Recognition of Student Groups*, this is a report on administrative decisions to grant, deny, or withdraw recognition for groups based on the UTSC campus for the 2023-24 academic year. There are 269 groups listed in this report that have been granted recognition from a total of 52 new group applications and 271 returning group applications.

Membership data provided in this report reveal that the cumulative number of UTSC members of all recognized student groups is 7,154 and the average number of UTSC members per student group is 27.

The size and diversity of the student community on the University of Toronto – Scarborough campus provides an extraordinary number of opportunities for students to participate in a vast array of activities undertaken by student organizations. Participation in these groups forms an integral part of the student experience. Student groups contribute, in a variety of ways, to the educational, intellectual, recreational, social, and cultural life of the University of Toronto community. For many students, involvement in voluntary student organizations is not only a traditional part of campus life; it forms a significant component of their learning while at the University.

Many recognized student organizations engage in co-curricular activities that enrich the participation of their members in their own academic programs. Involvement in a student organization can also provide significant learning opportunities for students with respect to leadership, civic and community engagement, and organizational capacity. Since many student organizations address the complex issues of the world around us, engagement in a student group can often provide important opportunities to be exposed to different ideas and perspectives. This helps the University provide meaningful opportunities for debate and dissent, and to foster the development of students' understanding of difference. Finally, participation in student groups provides one means by which students integrate and engage with small communities within the University of Toronto.

2023/24 Student Groups Portfolio

- New timeline for Renewal and Recognition (Implemented May 2023) - Alignment amongst all three campuses on the recognition period for student groups.
- Increased in number of Clubs Fairs (Increased from 4 in 2022-23, to 6 in 2023-24) - Club fair days were offered over the span of two months at the beginning of each semester to connect to students looking for community on campus.
- Implementing a Club Leaders Retreat (Summer 2023) - In the summer Student Life Programs hosted a two-day student leadership retreat for student executives. Content included event planning, risk management, and networking amongst student leaders.

Changes to the timeline for renewal and recognition were made to encourage groups to be recognized during the first two months of each semester, then staff can focus on supporting groups with their

programming (bookings and risk assessment) for the remainder of their year. The increased number of Clubs Fairs provided groups with more opportunities to showcase their programming, and events and visibility for students at large to join a group. Lastly, a Club Leaders Retreat ran in August 2023 to build the leadership skills for club executives and build community and collaboration between all clubs. It had a great turn out and response and it is planned to offer it an annual event for Club Leaders.

In accordance with the University's *Policy on the Recognition of Student Groups (the Policy)*, this is a report on administrative decisions to grant, deny, or withdraw recognition for groups based on the University of Toronto Scarborough campus in this academic year. The student groups listed below have been granted recognition until September 30, 2024.

All groups that have been granted recognition for the 2023-24 academic year are listed in this memorandum.

Recognition of student groups by the University provides several benefits and opportunities:

1. the right to use the name of the University in the name of the group and in conjunction with group activities;
2. eligibility to use University facilities and meeting spaces at no cost or at a lower cost compared to external organizations;
3. eligibility to apply for temporary office space;
4. listings in select University directories as a University-recognized student group;
5. verification letters confirming recognition status (sometimes required by banks and other external organizations); and
6. access to other University services and resources made available from time to time.

A student organization seeking recognition must submit an annual application to the Student Life Department along with a copy of group's constitution. The constitution outlines the group's purpose, objectives, and procedures. It addresses organizational structure, membership, meetings, the election or appointment of members in leadership positions, amendments to the constitution, and rules of conduct. A commitment to democracy and accountability to members should also be reflected.

Full membership in a recognized student group (including eligibility to vote and serve in a leadership position) must be open to any currently registered University of Toronto student from any division. While discriminatory membership practices are not allowed, it is acknowledged that certain groups could well be homogeneous in nature without being discriminatory. Status as non-voting members may be extended to other University community members or interested persons from outside the University.

Groups seeking recognition by the University must be genuine student organizations and generally non-profit in nature. A recognized student group cannot be controlled by any external body. However, many organizations are affiliated with provincial, national, or international bodies and other external groups.

Under the terms of the *Policy*, the University will not attempt to censor, control or interfere with any group on the basis of its philosophy, beliefs, interests or opinions expressed unless and until these lead to activities which are illegal or which infringe the rights and freedoms of others within the community. By the same token, recognition as a student group implies neither endorsement of a group's beliefs or

philosophy, nor the assumption of legal liability for the group’s activities. Please note that pursuant to the *Policy*, the recognition of student groups which draw their membership from only one academic division is delegated to the governance body of that division.

It is important to note that there are hundreds of additional clubs, many athletics and recreation activities, Hart House clubs and committees, as well as recognized student groups based on other campuses which, while not listed here, add significantly to the educational, intellectual, recreational, social, and cultural life of the U of T community. In addition, many students are involved in student governments, college and faculty student societies, course unions, and departmental student associations.
