UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO QUALITY ASSURANCE PROCESS (UTQAP)

- The UTQAP specifies protocols for:
 - development, appraisal and approval of entirely <u>new academic programs</u>
 - development and approval of proposals to significantly change existing academic programs (<u>major</u> <u>modifications</u>)
 - **closure** of existing degrees and programs
 - <u>cyclical review</u> of existing Faculties, units, and the programs they offer.
- Incorporates institutional commitments to equity, anti-racism, Indigeneity, and accessibility
- The UTQAP ensures that the University of Toronto operates in conformity with the Quality Assurance Framework (QAF) for the Province of Ontario




