Rossy Chair in Campus Mental Health

Dr. Kristin Cleverley is the inaugural Rossy Chair in Campus Mental Health

Dr. Cleverley is based in the Lawrence Bloomberg Faculty of Nursing and is also the Chair in Mental Health Nursing Research at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, and the Director of Inlight, the Student Mental Health Research Initiative.

Her 5-year term as the Rossy Chair in Campus Mental Health started in July 2024.

She will work with many collaborators, researchers, and the university community to enhance U of T's approach to student mental health and wellness.

This academic appointment aligns with several of the recommendations put forth by U of T's Presidential and Provostial Mental Health Task Force.
