

RECITALS:

- A. The City's Strategic Plan vision is to inspire the world as a dynamic and beautiful global city for creativity and innovation, with vibrant, safe and connected communities; where the rich diversity of cultures, historic villages, Lake Ontario and the Credit River valley are celebrated;
- B. The University's Statement of Institutional Purpose expresses its commitment to being an internationally significant research university, with undergraduate, graduate and professional programs of excellent quality and to fostering an academic community in which learning and scholarship of every member may flourish, with a vigilant protection for individual human rights, and a resolute commitment to the principles of equal opportunity, equity and justice. Within the unique university context, the most crucial of all human rights are the rights of freedom of speech, academic freedom, and freedom of research;
- The City and the University wish to strengthen their long-standing positive working relationship and undertake joint activities that support their respective goals, strengthen areas of common interest, and nourish reciprocal relationships;
- D. The University of Toronto Mississauga's Strategic Framework combined with the President's Three Priorities for the University of Toronto set the foundation to expand the nature and scope of working together with the City for mutual benefit, leveraging our location, expanding international relationships, and re-imagining undergraduate education;
- E. The City's Strategic Plan and implementing strategies, such as the Mississauga Economic Development Strategy, recommend harnessing the significant innovation potential of the University and building on the University's significant contributions within the city's social and urban landscape;
