## **HIGHLIGHTS**:

### 1. Ontario Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training & Skills Development (MLITSD)

During the reporting period, the MLITSD engaged with St. George campus on five occasions. One visit involved an anonymous complaint alleging that unlicensed technicians/plumbers were being used for a renovation project. The other four instances were related to injuries, including: a non-employee who fell on stairs); an employeeankle fracture; another ankle fracture sustained when an employee fell down stairs; and the final visit addressed an incident involving an employee who lost consciousness. No orders were given for any of these instances.

There were three visits to the UTM campus. Two visits addressed employee injuries (rolled ankle while walking and a follow-up visit related to the lawn mower rollover). On the third visit, MLITSD investigated

an employee complaint related to workplace harassment. No orders were issued in any of these instances.

MLITSD visited UTSC once regarding an employee who injured their left wrist while walking down the stairs. No orders were issued.

Note: In addition to these MLITSD visits, Toronto Public Health visited UTSC's Harmony Commons cafeteria at the University's request following reports of several gastrointestinal illness cases. Inspectors found no infractions and reissued the green pass certificate.

### 2. Regulatory Visits

- CFIA (Canadian Food Inspection Agency) visited UTSC for Plant Pest Inspection on November 21, 2024. No non-compliance was noted.
- CFIA & PHAC (Public Health Agency of Canada) conducted an inspection at St George Containment Level 3 facility (CL3) (under construction) which occurred on November 25, 2024. No non-compliance was noted.
- PHAC inspection of CL3 License inspection occurred October 23-24, 2024. No non-compliance was noted.

### 3. Incidents Abroad Relating to Students

One student abroad received assistance to return early from an exchange program due to personal family reasons.

### 4. Summary

In summary, based on the reports I have received on the operation of our occupational health and safety policy, and to the best of my knowledge, the University is compliant with its health and safety obligations.
