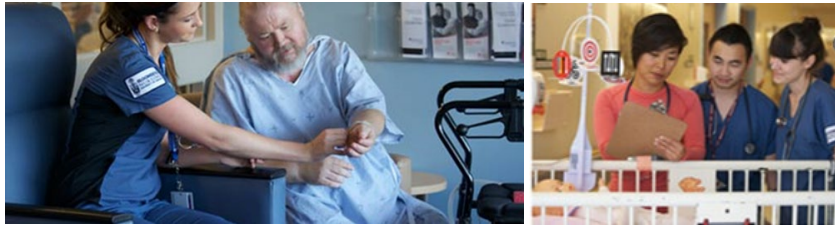

BScN at a Glance

- 2-year full-time second entry undergraduate program
- 231 students enrolled each year with 462 students in the program
- Applicants must have completed at least 10 university full course equivalents prior to admission
- To qualify for the BScN degree, students must complete 13.5 full-course equivalents (FCEs)
- Students complete 1216 hours of clinical learning starting in week 2 in term 1 through to completion

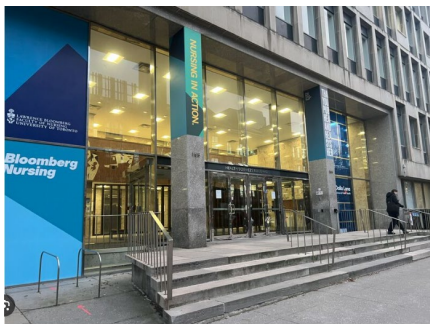
Nursing at UTM -Goals

Our goals are to:

- Facilitate a pathway for prospective students from more diverse communities in and around Mississauga and the Peel Region to access our BScN program and pursue a career in nursing.
- Increase awareness of the BScN program among UTM undergraduate students.
- For BScN graduates who are located at UTM and live in Mississauga to enter the workforce in Mississauga.
- Increase and expand collaboration with health care providers and organisations (e.g., Trillium Health Partners) within the western GTA.
- Help address the increased need for healthcare providers in Mississauga.
