Re: Call for Nominations for the Advisory Committee on the Appointment

of a Vice-President, Operations and Real Estate Partnerships

On June 30, 2026, Professor Scott Mabury will complete his term as <u>Vice-President</u>, <u>Operations and Real Estate Partnerships</u>, a position that he holds concurrently with his position of Vice-Provost, Academic Operations. Professor Mabury has served as a Vice-President since 2012 and as Vice-Provost since 2009. Over his lengthy tenure he has had a transformative impact on a wide range of areas of the University.

Given the unique structure of this Vice-Presidential portfolio at its inception and its continued evolution, the Committee will be undertaking a review of the portfolio and will advise me on its structure. The outcome of that will determine the nature of the search. Professor Mabury has indicated that he may consider seeking a reappointment in some capacity.

At this time, I am writing to call for nominations of individuals to serve on the Advisory Committee. The membership will comprise:

- 4 to 6 members of the teaching staff, including academic administrators,
- 1 to 2 members of the administrative staff, and,
- 2 to 3 Lieutenant Governor-in-Council (LGIC) and/or Alumni members of the Governing Council.

Ms Sheree Drummond, Secretary of the Governing Council, will serve as secretary to the Committee.
