Navigation simplified & Health Promotion amplified

Mental Health Resource Portal

NEW U of T Mental Health portal launched & had over 55,522 page views during reporting period.

11,165 messages (30%) pertained to health.

Health Promotion

NEW low barrier, drop-in support, as well as customized programs for Indigenous, BIPOC, 2SLGBTQIA+ students. There were 28,000 contacts with students and health-promotion teams.



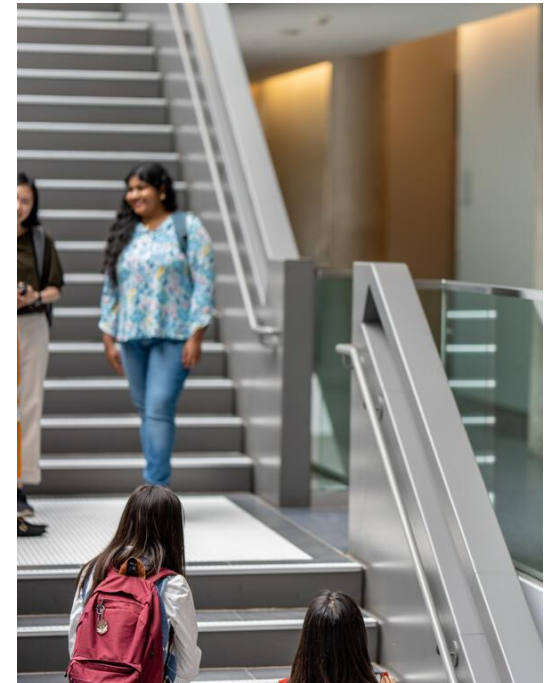

Peer Support

- **Students report** – the first step in seeking help, accessing U of T resources.
- Last year, **300 peer connections** through an outreach model (Libraries, etc.).



Health Centres offer 1:1 Counselling services (OAAT)

Mental Health appointments

50% of activity were for mental health (MH) concerns.

Over 14,000 appointments

6423 unique students made appointments (27% MH services).

One at a Time (OAAT) model

86% of these students used one to three OAATs; 14% engaged more sessions.

No wait times

95% of appointment requests booked without delay.
