#### **ITEM IDENTIFICATION:**

Provost's Annual Report on Non-Academic Discipline for 2001-2002

#### JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The Memorandum on the Maintenance and Use of Records of Non-Academic Discipline Proceedings, which is appended to the Code of Student Conduct, 1996, provides that:

Decisions of the Hearing Officer, including the name of the respondent, the offence and the sanction, shall be reported to the Vice-President & Provost, who shall convey the information, anonymously and in statistical form, annually to the University Affairs Board.

#### PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

The Board received the Annual Report for 2000-2001 at its meeting of November 5, 2001.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

The new *Code of Student Conduct, 2002* came into force on July 1, 2002. Consequently this is the last year for reporting under the 1996 *Code*. The number of reported incidents remains low; however, most of the incidents investigated were quite serious matters.

#### **Summary:**

Nine offenses involving five students were investigated in 2001-2002. Two cases, involving five offenses, have not yet been resolved. In two other cases the students admitted to the offenses and the matters have been settled. One case went to a hearing and the student was found guilty of two offenses under the *Code*.

### **Case Summaries:**

- Case 1: Charges were laid against a student for the assault of an instructor and a teaching assistant. The Hearing Officer convicted the student on both charges and recommended expulsion. An appeal to the Discipline Appeals Board remains pending.
- Case 2 A student has been charged with four offenses under the code relating to stalking activity. The student has admitted to some of the alleged behaviour. The matter remains pending resolution.
- Case 3: A student was charged with a disruption offense for lewd behaviour in a library. The student has entered into a behaviour contract with the division.
- Case 4: It is alleged that a student was stalking the complainant. The student has been charged. A hearing is pending.
- Case 5: A student has admitted striking the complainant in a classroom. The student has entered into a behaviour contract and the matter has been resolved.
