ITEM IDENTIFICATION:

Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees – Student Society Fees: University of Toronto Mississauga Part-time Students Societies, Representation and Fees

JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

The University Affairs Board is responsible for policy concerning representative student committees, student societies and campus organizations.

The University of Toronto Act (1947) provides that the Governing Council "may make provision for enabling the students of the University, University College and the federated colleges to appoint a representative committee of themselves to be chosen in such manner as shall be approved by the [Governing Council], which shall be the recognized official student medium of communication on behalf of such students between them and the [Governing Council]."

The terms of reference of the University Affairs Board provide that the Board approves the establishment of and changes to compulsory non-academic incidental fees including those collected on behalf of student societies. The administrative procedures are outlined in the *Policy on Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees* and the *Handbook for Student Societies* (published by the Office of the Vice-Provost, Students). Pursuant to the *Policy*, requests for increases to fees must be supported by due constitutional and fair processes within student societies.

Requests for increases are brought forward to the Board by the administration on the assurances of the student societies that due constitutional procedures have been followed.

Increases which are greater than the cost of living must be supported by a positive result in a recent referendum. Requests for increases which are less than or equal to the cost of living must be supported by a previous referendum approving annual increases by an established inflation factor. When such a provision is approved by referendum, annual increases, no greater than the Ontario Consumer Price Index of the previous December (or no greater than a specific inflation factor approved by referendum), may be requested upon approval of the board or council of the organization.

PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

At present, there are four "representative student committees:" the Students' Administrative Council (SAC; currently operating as the University of Toronto Student Union; representing all full-time undergraduate students on the St. George and Mississauga campuses), the Graduate Students' Union (GSU; representing all graduate students all on campuses); the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS; representing all part-

time undergraduate students on all campuses), and the Scarborough Campus Students' Union (SCSU; representing all full-time undergraduate students on the Scarborough campus). SCSU became a representative student committee in 2004, while APUS became a representative student committee in the early 1970s. Prior to this, SAC represented all undergraduate students on all campuses.

Requests for changes to existing fees and/or the establishment of new fees are brought forward to the Board on one or more occasions each year.

The requests have been reviewed by the Office of Vice-Provost, Students and are recommended for approval.

RECOMMENDATION:

Subject to the conditions and expectations delineated below, it is recommended that the University Affairs Board approve the following.

3.(a) University of Toronto Mississauga Part-time Student Societies: Fees

Be It Resolved,

THAT all fees currently charged to University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM) students on behalf of Erindale Part-time Undergraduate Students (EPUS) be discontinued, and by virtue of this change, that EPUS no longer be recognized as a student society of the University of Toronto;

THAT all fees currently charged to UTM students on behalf of the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS) be discontinued; and

THAT a new fee of \$80.51 be established and charged on behalf of the Erindale College Students' Union (currently operating as the UTM Students' Union; UTMSU) to UTM part-time undergraduate students including designated portions for the Society (\$12.65), an Accident and Prescription Drug insurance plan (\$28.80, including provincial sales tax), a Dental Plan (\$27.45, including provincial sales tax), the Ontario Public Interest Research Group (\$0.50 in fall and winter, \$1.00 in summer), the Canadian Federation of Students (CFS) and CFS-Ontario (\$3.31), and the UTM Student Centre (\$7.80).

3.(b) University of Toronto Mississauga Part-time Student Societies: Recognition as a Representative Student Committee

THAT the Governing Council cease its recognition of APUS as the Representative Student Committee of part-time undergraduate students registered at the UTM; and

THAT the Erindale College Students' Union (currently operating as the UTMSU) be recognized as the Representative Student Committee and primary representative body of part-time undergraduate students registered at UTM.

Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees – Student Society Fees: University of Toronto Mississauga Part-time Students Societies, Representation and Fees

Terms and conditions of the foregoing recommendation and approval:

- 1. That for the purposes of the *Memorandum of Agreement between the University of Toronto, the Students' Administrative Council, the Graduate Students' Union and the Association of Part-Time Undergraduate Students for a Long-Term Protocol on the Increase or Introduction of Compulsory Non-Tuition Related Fees* (the "Protocol"), the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students shall continue to represent part-time undergraduate students registered at UTM until such time as a new or revised Protocol is approved;
- 2. That the Erindale College Students' Union (currently operating as the UTMSU) will: (a) undertake, in consultation with the Students' Administrative Council (currently operating as the UTSU), to address the formal representation of full-time undergraduate UTM students; and (b) will report to the administration the society's progress on addressing this matter no later than the spring of 2010.

The Erindale College Student Union (currently operating as the University of Toronto Mississauga Students' Union, UTMSU) recently held a referendum among part-time undergraduate students at UTM to seek support to realign formal representation of part-time students on the Mississauga campus and to realign the fees paid to the Association of Part-time Undergraduate Students (APUS), the Erindale Part-time Undergraduate Students (EPUS), and UTMSU. At present, the Students' Administrative Council (currently operating as the University of Toronto Students' Union, UTSU) and APUS are recognized by the Governing Council as the formal representatives of UTM students as "representative student committees" pursuant to the *University of Toronto Act* (1947).

The *Act* provides that the Governing Council "may make provision for enabling the students of the University, University College and the federated colleges to appoint a representative committee of themselves to be chosen in such manner as shall be approved by the [Governing Council], which shall be the recognized official student medium of communication on behalf of such students between them and the [Governing Council]."

The referendum, therefore, was designed primarily to (a) support a request to the Governing Council to designate UTMSU as the formal representative of part-time undergraduate UTM students, and to (b) realign fees charged by the University on behalf of APUS and EPUS. This memorandum addresses the issues related to the recognition of a new representative student committee pursuant to the *University of Toronto Act* as well as issues related to the approval of student society fees pursuant to the *Policy for Compulsory Non-Academic Incidental Fees*.

Background

In fall/winter 2007-08, the APUS fee was \$73.71 per session for part-time undergraduate students on all campuses. The EPUS fee was \$8.80 per session in fall/winter 2007-08 for part-time undergraduate students at UTM. The EPUS fee was \$17.60 for part-time undergraduate students at UTM in summer 2007.

Requests

The letter of request from the presidents of UTMSU and EPUS are attached to this memorandum. The letter delineates six requests:

- 1) That the EPUS fee be reduced to zero;
- 2) That the APUS fee for UTM students be reduced to zero;
- 3) That the fees be adjusted according to the referendum question (see below);
- 4) that EPUS' recognition as a student society of the University of Toronto be withdrawn;
- 5) that APUS be de-recognized as the "representative student committee" for UTM parttime undergraduate students; and
- 6) that UTMSU be recognized as the "representative student committee" for UTM parttime undergraduate students.

A referendum was held on February 6-7, 2008, in which part-time undergraduate UTM students were asked to support the proposal. The advertisement for the referendum which appeared in *The Medium* is attached. The wording of the question is as follows:

Preamble:

The University of Toronto Mississauga Students Union (UTMSU) and the Erindale Part-time Undergraduate Students (EPUS) are proposing to fold EPUS into UTMSU and unite all full and part-time UTM undergraduate students together by eliminating UTM part-time undergraduate student membership in EPUS and the Association of Part-Time Undergraduate Students (APUS). In this realignment, the services and representation currently offered by UTMSU, EPUS and APUS would be offered through membership in UTMSU. A UTMSU parttime student levy of \$76.70 per session would replace the current EPUS and APUS levies totalling [sic] \$78.40 per session (EPUS fee of \$ 8.80 per session fee and APUS fee of \$69.60 per session). Annual cost of living and inflation increases would continue to be applied to the relevant designated portions of the fee (subject to the provisions and conditions noted on the back of this ballot) beginning with the fall 2008 session. Fees for the Ontario Public interest Research Group, the Canadian Federation of Students and the Canadian Federation of Students–Ontario would remain unchanged.

The society has submitted the required documentation and two officers of the society have signed a declaration certifying that the society has acted in an open and democratic fashion and in a manner consistent with its constitution and/or by-laws. No complaints were received by this office concerning the referendum or the request for an increase.
