Teaching Staff Election (Constituency VI) for Governing Council

All teaching staff who have registered their utoronto.ca email addresses in HRIS must vote online¹.

Before accessing the on-line ballot, please read the following instructions carefully:

- 1. Review the candidates' statements.
- 2. You may vote for only one (1) candidate out of the two (2) candidates. Choose the candidate for whom you wish to vote.
- 3. To access the on-line ballot, you must enter your personnel number and date of birth.
- 4. Verification of eligibility to vote in the various constituencies will be determined by records provided by HRIS.
- 5. Please note: to protect confidentiality, your personnel number and your vote are stored separately.
- 6. Once recognized as a valid voter, you will be directed to the constituency ballot for which you are eligible to vote.
- 7. Once you have accessed the ballot, you MUST cast your vote. If you log-on and then exit the ballot without voting, you will not be able to re-access the ballot.
- 8. If you do not select a candidate, a warning message will inform you that a selection has not been made. If you choose to cast a blank ballot, the ballot will be accepted as submitted.
- 9. After your vote is registered, you cannot access the ballot a second time.
