A by-election is required to fill <u>one vacancy</u> for a teaching staff member to represent the Leslie Dan Faculty of Pharmacy on the Academic Board. The term would begin immediately upon the completion of the by-election and would end on June 30, 2012.

The Academic Board of the Governing Council is composed of 122 voting members, 50 of whom are teaching staff elected to the Board. The Board is concerned with matters affecting the teaching, learning, and research functions of the University, the establishment of University objectives and priorities, the development of long-term and short-term plans, and the effective use of resources in the course of these pursuits. The Board is responsible for approving matters such as research policy, budget guidelines and the annual budget, the establishment of new academic programs, admissions and awards policies, and academic discipline.
