## **ITEM IDENTIFICATION:**

UTSC East Arrival Court – increase appropriation.

### JURISDICTIONAL INFORMATION:

Pursuant to Section 5.2. (b) of its Terms of Reference, the Business Board approves Expenditures for, and the execution of, approved Capital Projects.

#### **PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:**

Previously approved at Business Board, February 2006.

#### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

The project was originally approved at a total cost of \$3,112,642, and was subsequently put on hold awaiting the outcome of a new master planning exercise for the campus. The project has now been revisited and redesigned. The revised total project cost is \$4,017,941.

Benefits of this project include:

- members of the surrounding community who will no longer be delayed in traveling on Military Trail, as fewer cars will be backed up onto this main street;
- members of the UTSC community who travel to and from campus using public transportation; TTC and GO Transit riders will use a dedicated bus facility separate from private vehicles, with bus shelters for protection from the elements;
- permit parkers who will have direct access route from Military Trail to the parking lots;
- visitors to the South campus who will have an increased number of convenient spaces in which to park;
- members of the community who are picked up or dropped off in private vehicles, giving them a centrally-located, dedicated, self-regulated area to use for this purpose;



- all members of the community who use or traverse the East Arrival Court; these persons will benefit from improved pedestrian walkways that feature fewer opportunities for pedestrians to come into contact with moving vehicles;
- members of the community walking from the South campus to the Student Center and Arts & Administration building who will use a new accessible pedestrian ramp leading from the bus facility to the upper-level courtyard between the above mentioned buildings;
- visitors who require accessible parking, having an increased number of barrierfree spaces in which to park.

# FINANCIAL AND/OR PLANNING IMPLICATIONS:

This project will greatly improve traffic flows, safety and convenience at what is a busy entry to the campus.

# **RISK IMPLICATIONS:**

- 1. Possible delays in the municipal approvals process, which includes various permits, committee of adjustment, and site plan approval.
- 2. Unanticipated site conditions discovered during excavation.
- 3. Labour disruptions in the construction industry.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the Vice-President University Operations be authorized to implement the East Arrival Court at UTSC at a total project cost of \$4,017,941, with sources of funding as follows:

Investment Income:	\$306,924
