STATEMENT:

1. Ontario Ministry of Labour (MOL) Visits and Orders

During this reporting period (January 1 - March 31, 2013) the Ministry of Labour visited the University five times.

There were two critical injuries in this reporting period, both related to falls, one at St. George and one at UTM. No orders given.

Three visits were follow-up due to employee complaints. Orders were given pertaining to one employee complaint at UTM with regards to eyewash access. Orders have been complied with.

2. Regulatory Visits

There have been two visits from CSNC inspectors within this reporting period regarding the consolidated license type II inspection. No issues noted.
