The Chair said that the Agenda Committee received the summary reports of reviews of academic programs and units and the minutes of the Committee on Academic Policy and Programs

1. Reviews of Academic Programs and Units: April – October 2013 (cont'd)

meeting at which the reviews were discussed. Under the *Policy for Approval and Review of Academic Programs and Units*, the Committee was responsible for identifying any specific academic issues raised by the overview of reviews that warranted discussion by the Academic Board.

Following discussion, members agreed that a brief report of the review and follow-up report should be provided to the Academic Board at its meeting of November 21, 2013. Members noted that it was anomalous to receive only one review. Typically, multiple reviews were received for review by the Committee on Academic Policy and Programs; that was expected to be the case in the Spring, 2014.

2. Academic Board

a) Orientation Evaluation

The Chair commented on the Academic Board orientation that had been held on October 3, 2013 immediately before the Board meeting. Of the approximately 30 new and continuing members who had attended the session, 53% had completed the online evaluation form. In general, the responses indicated that members had found the orientation valuable. The panel discussion of current and former Board members that had been moderated by the Vice-Chair had been well-received. As well, Professor Regehr's presentation on the development of academic proposals had been informative. It would be important to continue to identify means of helping Board members develop a strong understanding of their role and facilitate ongoing learning experiences.

A member said that service on committees of the Board would contribute to a deeper understanding of Board functions; to that end, members should be encouraged to consider such service. A member observed that one portion of the orientation, which had consisted of a step-by-step guide to the use of governance cover sheets, had been very favourably rated. Perhaps, in the future, a similar step-by-step approach could be applied to other sections of the orientation for the benefit of Board members.

2b) Review and Approval of Agenda – Thursday, November 21, 2013

The Committee reviewed and approved the draft agenda for the November 21, 2013 Board meeting. With respect to the three academic plans that would be provided to the Board for information and discussion (Faculty of Information, Faculty of Kinesiology and Physical Education, and University of Toronto Libraries), it was agreed that, following an overview of University academic plans that would be provided by Professor Regehr, the Deans and Chief Librarian would be invited to speak for a few minutes about the process followed in developing their respective plans.

2b) Review and Approval of Agenda – Thursday, November 21, 2013 (cont'd)

Mr. Lang responded to comments from members on the 2012-2013 Academic Discipline Annual Report and the Fall 2013 University Tribunal and Academic Appeals Committee Semi-Annual Reports of Individual Cases. It was suggested, that in the future, further information be included in the Academic Discipline Annual Report that would enable readers to understand better the variability of offences among divisions. Mr. Lang noted that the number of offences in some divisions was masked because they were included in the School of Graduate Studies data. A member suggested that it would be helpful to learn more about the type of offences that were committed by students in each division.
