Section II: Nominee's Responsibility

It is the Nominee's responsibility to file a bona fide nomination. Errors or irregularities in these papers constitute grounds for rejection of the nomination. Errors or irregularities may be corrected prior to the close of nominations. Please refer to the *Election Guidelines 2014* for additional instructions. The Office of Governing Council will attempt to notify candidates of the existence of any errors or irregularities during this period, but is not bound to do so. Candidates are advised to complete and submit their nomination papers early in the nomination period.

Section III: Definitions and Maximum Term for Members

The definition of "**Teaching Staff**" below is an extract from the *Election Guidelines 2014*. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are eligible by consulting the *Election Guidelines 2014*, which provides more details for this definition and the eligibility criteria.

"Teaching Staff" means the employees of the University, University College, the Constituent Colleges and the arts and science faculties of the Federated Universities who hold the academic rank of professor, associate professor, assistant professor, full-time lecturer or part-time lecturer, unless such part-time lecturer is registered as a Student, or who hold any other rank created by the Governing Council and designated by it as an academic rank for the purposes of clause 1 (1) (m) of the *Act*. For the purpose of Governing Council elections, lecturer includes the ranks of Lecturer, Senior Lecturer, Tutor, and Senior Tutor. Lecturer also includes associates in the Faculty of Dentistry. Assistant Professor (conditional), Sessional Lecturer I, Sessional Lecturer III, Sessional Lecturer III, Athletics Instructor, and Senior Athletics Instructor have been designated by the Governing Council as academic ranks for the purposes of clause 1 (1) (m) of the *Act*.

Elected members of the Academic Board may serve for a maximum of nine consecutive years.

Section IV: Optional Statement

The nominee may submit a typed biographical statement or other comments, up to a limit of 100 words. The candidate's name will not be counted in the 100-word total if placed at the beginning of the statement. Abbreviations and acronyms will be counted as one word. The nominee's URL will not be counted in the 100 word limit and should be placed at the end of the statement. This statement will be published in the campus media and linked to the ballot on the web. If a statement exceeds 100 words in length, only the first 100 words will be printed. It is emphasized that the submission of the biographical statement or other comments is voluntary.
