At its hearing on Wednesday, July 28, 1976, the Local Branch of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That in the term test in Anthropology 220 on April 2, 1976, you represented as your own work that which was in fact that of another student with the intent to deceive within the meaning of Section R.1 (a) (ii) of the Academic Code of Behaviour.

In accordance with Section 63 of the Rules of Procedure of the University of Toronto Disciplinary Structure, I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the University Tribunal with respect to this charge.

The decision of the jury on the question of sanctioning on the charge to which you pleaded guilty was that you be censured but that this particular censure not be entered on your transcript.
