Dear Ms. Y.

At its hearing on Monday, June 2, 1980 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you -

- that in the spring term of 1980, as a student at Erindale College in PHL 274S, you knowingly did submit work which you represented as your own but which was partially or completely the work of another, contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) of the Academic Code of Behaviour.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and ordered that the following sanction be imposed:

- 1) that PHL 274S be recorded on your transcript with a mark of zero; and
- 2) a notation that this zero was the penalty for plagiarism be recorded on your academic transcript until one year after graduation.

The jury provided the following reason for the sanction:

'the jury wants to reinforce what we consider to be the serious nature of the offence without wanting this notation to be a permanent liability for Ms. Y.
